"This is a consequence of global recession. As the prices of products in the global market have experienced sharp fall, the factory owners failed to pay the labours and this resulted in such unrest," he said while addressing a workshop on WTO affairs at Hotel Sonargaon in the city.

Bangladesh Foreign Trade Institute organised the workshop on 'WTO Notification

Procedures and Obligations.' over by Prof MA Taslim, was also addressed by Mahbubur Rahman, president of International Chamber of Commerce-Bangladesh.

Blaming the developed nations for the global financial crisis, the minister said that because of their wrong policies, the poor countries have been suffering financially.
