Lone concrete sleeper plant falls asleep

Production in the lone concrete sleeper plant of Bangladesh Railway has remained suspended for over a year making many rail tracks vulnerable.

An unusual delay in importing raw materials from India put the production at the 'Pre-Stressed Concrete Sleeper Plant' at Chhatak to a complete halt in June last year, provided jobs to 100 employees. official sources said.

Railway authorities cannot supply sleeper now though many tracks require immediate replacement. Its reserve stocks

exhausted three months back. The plant, set up in 1986 with a longterm plan of replacing the wooden sleepers in phases by the concrete ones, is dependent on import of two major raw materials-MCI (malleable cast iron) and HT steel wares (high tension steel wares).

The plant, which started with an annual production target of 50,000 pieces of sleepers and gradually succeeded in increasing the output to 90,000 pieces a year, was last supplied with the raw materials in May 2007. In 2007-08 fiscal, 86,000 pieces of

materials was placed before the railway headquarters well in advance, the plant is yet to get the imported materials, an official of the plant told The Daily Staryesterday.

Sources said a tender process for import of 2,40,000 pieces of MCI and 300 tons of HT steel wire was completed in August last year. After several months, the authorities con-

cerned cancelled the process in April this year, sources said.

Now preparations are underway to float a fresh tender for import of the aforesaid quantity of raw materials. It may take a few more months to complete the import pro-

"We were compelled to suspend producsleepers were produced in the plant that tion since June last year with the exhaustion of the stocks of raw materials received in Although the annual demand for raw May 2007," the plant in-charge Executive Engineer Hirendranath Majumder told The Daily Star.

Every year the tender process takes much time resulting in unscheduled suspension of the plant's production, sources alleged, adding that this time the unusual delay put the railway in a vulnerable situation.

life for looting a Brac office

A court here yesterday sentenced two JMB leaders and their three accomplices to life term imprisonment for looting a local Brac office six years back.

The convicts are JMB Dhaka divisional north unit commander Salahuddin alias Salehin and Sherpur district commander Mujahidul Islam Sumon and their cohorts Hasmat Ali, Kalu and Kashem Ali.

All but Kashem Ali were present in the court during the verdict.

The court also acquitted seven other accused as allegations brought against them could not be proved.

According to the prosecution, the convicts led by JMB kingpins Sheikh Abdur Rahman and Bangla Bhai swooped on Dhanshai Brac office after blasting a bomb in Jhenaigati upazila on February 9, 2003 and looted its valuables and docu-

Two Brac employees were injured in the bomb blast.

Brac area officer Kamal Bashar filed a dacoity case on the following day with the local police station.

The names of Sheikh Abdur Rahman and Bangla Bhai have been dropped from the case after they were executed during the immediate past caretaker government regime.

After examining the records and witnesses, Judge of the Joint District and Sessions Judge Court-1 Badrul Islam handed down the verdict.

Bangladesh's exports to China were worth \$107 million, and imports from China \$3,500 million in fiscal year (FY) 2007-'08. The gap was \$645 million in FY.2000-'01.

The goods for which Bangladesh will seek dutyfree access include food items, garments, and jute and leather products.

Increased exchange of visits by trade delegations of the two countries and frequent visits by teams from important chambers of commerce and trade associations in Bangladesh, and meetings with their Chinese counterparts will also be among Dhaka's proposals, officials said.

"We are going to place the proposals to bolster economic relations between the two countries, reduce trade gap and increase Chinese investment," said a senior official of the finance ministry.

Dhaka will also seek financial and technical assistance for some mutually agreed important projects for socio-economic development of Bangladesh, he said. Since Bangladeshi entrepreneurs often face difficulties in obtaining Chinese visa, Dhaka will request Beijing to review the existing Mutual Exemption of Visa Agreement that does not cover business and tourist visas.

A proposal for a comprehensive consular agreement is under consideration of the Chinese government to address the visa issue, the official said. "Dhaka hopes China will expedite the process in view of the growing economic and trade relations with Bangladesh."

Economic Relations Division (ERD) Secretary Mosharraf Hossain Bhuiyan, who is leading a sevenmember delegation to the JEC meeting, said the main focus of their discussion will be on how to decrease the trade gap.

"We will also discuss a number of important projects, and we are hopeful of positive outcome," Mosharraf told The Daily

India launches indigenous N-powered submarine

India yesterday joined a select group of countries with the launch of its first indigenous nuclear-powered submarine as Prime Minister Manmohan Singh said New Delhi does not have any aggressive design but asserted "eternal vigilance is the price of liberty."

The submarine, the first of five planned, is powered by an 85-megawatt nuclear reactor and can reach 44 kilometres an hour (24 knots) underwater, according to defence officials.

It will be armed with torpedoes and ballistic missiles, and carryacrewof95 men.

The INS Arihant will be commissioned in the Indian Navy after extensive outfitting and sea trials. It is the first of three such vessels to be built in the country and marks a quantum leap in India's shipbuilding capabilities.

The launch of INS Arihant is a major step towards India's building an effective response to a possible nuclear attack by giving the country the ability to launch atomic weapons from land, air and from under the sea.

Speaking at the launch of the submarine christened INS Arihant at Visakhapatnam, Singh said the event is a "historic milestone in the country's defence preparedness and a reflection of the immense technical expertise that exists in our country and the strength of our research and development organisations."

"More importantly, the launch represents the determination and patriotism of our technologists, scientists and defence personnel who have overcome several hurdles and barriers to enable the country to acquire self-reliance in the most advanced areas of defence technology," he said.

Three people, including a journalist, were killed and three others injured as a bus rammed their private car on Rangpur-Bogra Highway at Rahubal in Shibganj upazila yesterday morning.

Police said the accident occurred when a bus of Chishtia Paribahan rammed their car, coming from opposite direction, at around 6:45 am.

Dhaka will formally request Beijing to provide \$1.4 billion to implement the Ganges Barrage Project, and \$88.12 million for restoration of the flow of Buriganga river and for a project for prevention of river pollution, says the list of projects to be discussed at the talk.

Earlier, Bangladesh requested China to provide \$560 million for implementing the North-West Fertiliser Company Limited project. China however proposed a mixed credit scheme for the project, to which Bangladesh responded by urging China in June this year to provide the assistance for Shahjalal Fertiliser Company in Fenchuganjinstead.

At the talk in Beijing, once Karnaphuli tunnel at an again Bangladesh will request for a financial assistance of \$600 million for the much awaited Rooppur February 2007, ERD sought the assistance from China, but a response is yet to come. National ICT infrastruc-


