



Restore canals, wetlands to stop waterlogging

Suggest experts as water bodies being lost due to unplanned urbanisation

Mindless destruction of natural water bodies in and around Dhaka coupled with flagrant disregard for urban planning of successive governments have brought the capital to its knees, said noted urban experts.

The Government must recover rivers and water bodies from encroachers and institute a single authority for a handy drainage system to save the capital from water logging, they said.

Prof Nazrul Islam, a noted urban researcher and currently the chairman of

University Grants Commission, said the government must ensure flow capacity of canals and rivers and recover flood retention ponds in and around Dhaka city.

"The government has to retrieve the flood flow zones from unauthorised plan housing projects, put a functional drainage system in place and recover water bodies and reservoirs," he said.

A high-powered authority at the Prime Minister's Office is imperative in this regard to help coordinate the city governance through different agencies, he suggested.

Dhaka Water Supply and Sewerage

Authority (Wasa) has to update and implement the drainage management master plan while government should adopt and apply a comprehensive physical development policy and urbanisation

Prof Sarwar Jahan of urban and regional planning department of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) and president of Bangladesh Institute of Planners, said, "Dhaka is not a planned city. The city was ill-planned."

Genocide still haunts survivors

It was on a Friday in the end of March in 1971 when Samiran Nesa last saw her neighbour Abdur Rahman being dragged away by Biharis from a road near the place now known as Jalladkhana in Mirpur.

Rahman appeared on the scene after the Azan for Juma prayers was announced and he was never seen again.

Govt plans to issue bonds for \$500m

IMF to give low-interest loan

The government is planning to issue bonds to meet \$500 million expected fund gap for the Padma Bridge project.

Following an inter-ministerial meeting at the finance ministry on implementation of World Bank financed programmes and projects, Finance Minister AMA Muhith told reporters yesterday that \$1.8 to \$1.9 billion will be required to complete the Padma Bridge.

He also said the government might face a funding gap of around \$500 million, but bridging the gap will not be a major problem as it is thinking of issuing bonds to cover the deficit.


