at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban. He said they had taken the The parliamentary body on initiative to identify the freedom fighters.

> The sub-committee headed by Shamsur Rahman Sharif has been asked to exchange views with various sections of people and organisations to prepare the draft, said Awami League lawmaker Rafigul Islam.
