National Rickets Survey 2008 revealed that around 5.50 lakh children aged between 1 and 15 years have been suffering from rickets.

The rickets situation is worst in Cox's Bazar as the children's daily intake of calcium there is 160 milligrams per day against World Health Organisation (WHO) recommended level of 500-800 milligrams per day.

Experts have also termed rickets as a cross-cutting health problem that involves nutrition, food habit, environmental degradation, chemical fertiliser, change of crop pattern, micronutrients, poverty and multi-dimensional social






