Leaders of indigenous communities in different districts have reiterated their demand for constitutional recognition of the indigenous people and ensuring their fundamental rights.

At discussions marking the International Day of World's Indigenous People yesterday, they also emphasised primary education through mother tongue and protecting traditional culture and heritage of the indigenous communities.

Adivasi people played a significant role during the Liberation War in 1971 but they are yet to be given constitutional recognition, speakers Municipality office, reports our correspondent.




Foreign liquor seized
