Clijsters' triumphant return

Former world number one the US Open in 2005, weath-Kim Clijsters made a triumphant return to tennis on Monday, defeating France's Marion Bartoli in straight away an opening set in which sets in her first match in more than two years.

Clijsters, who retired in May of 2007 and gave birth to a daughter in February of 2008, defeated 12th-seeded Bartoli 6-4, 6-3.

"I'm really excited playing my first match," said Clijsters, 26, who received a wild card into the draw of the tournament which has been bumped up to WTA premier status.

"I've been training since the start of February, and I've always been focused on Cincinnati. Winning my first match feels good."

The ebullient Belgian advanced to a second-round clash against Switzerland's Patty Schnyder, a 6-4, 6-0 winner over Argentina's Gisela Dulko.

American Serena Williams, seeded second here behind world number one Dinara Safina, said she was impressed with Clijsters even before the Belgian hit a ball in anger.

"I look like I had a kid more than she does, Williams said in a meet the press session Monday. "She looks amazing.



Zaheer against anti-doping policy

Zaheer Khan has said that Indian cricketers were not the only sportsmen to oppose the 'whereabouts' clause in the WADA code.

"I'm sure athletes all over the world have problems with the clause. It is high time someone took the initiative and we are happy that we did it," he said.

Zaheer said that drug testing would be good for the game. He also said that Indian cricketers were willing to undergo tests and had concerns only over the clause which required players to disclose their whereabouts three months in advance.

"We absolutely have no objection to be tested," he said. "We know it's important for the game that the players are tested, it's undoubtedly for the betterment of the game we play. It's only a particular clause that we don't agree to."

The fast bowler said that while the players had the support of the BCCI, they would adhere to the decision of the board.

Zaheer, who suffered a major shoulder injury last month and has been ruled out of the Champions Trophy, said he had taken it in his stride. "We just can't wish away injuries. They are part and parcel of the sport, and one just has to be patient. As far as I am concerned, it's certainly not a setback for me; I am actually viewing it as an opportunity to come back stronger and fitter."

Flintoff to play finale

England have been given a huge boost ahead of next week's Ashes decider with the announcement that key all-rounder Andrew Flintoff is set

for a farewell to Test cricket at the Oval. An England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) statement issued Monday said swelling on his right knee injury had "significantly eased"

Flintoff was ruled out of the fourth Test here at Headingley, where England were thrashed inside three days by an innings and 80 runs on Sunday, because of his longstanding knee injury.

England, with the series all square at 1-1, must win at the Oval -- where the fifth Test starts on August 20 -- to regain the Ashes, while Australia need only a draw to retain them.

But if their talismanic all-rounder is in the side, home fans will dream of a fairytale finale for both Flintoff and England.

An ECB statement said: "Andrew Flintoff's right knee injury was reviewed today (Monday) by his specialist in conjunction with the ECB and Lancashire CCC medical teams.

"The advice received was the swelling in his knee has significantly eased following the decision by the England management team to rest him from the last Test match and that, subject to further rest and intensive treatment, he will be available for selection for the fifth npower Ashes Test at the Brit Oval."

England took the controversial decision to leave out the 31-year-old all-rounder, the bowling star of their 115-run second Test win at Lord's and topscorer in the drawn third Test at Edgbaston, from their fourth Test side because of concerns his knee injury would prevent him seeing out the game.

In pace bowler and hard-hitting batsman Flintoff's absence, England were humiliated at Headingley. To make matters worse, fast bowler James Anderson sustained a hamstring injury.

But the ECB said Flintoff's Lancashire colleague was also set to be available at the Oval.

"James Anderson also underwent a scan on his hamstring, which was clear," their statement said. "As there is no evidence of a significant tear, it is anticipated that he will also be available for selection for next week's final Test.'

Flintoff, the star of England's 2005 Ashes series win, has had an injury-blighted career and he said before the match at Lord's that this would be his final Test series.

Andrew Chandler, Flintoff's agent, was adamant his client could have played at Headingley, telling Monday's edition of The Times: "He told them he was fit enough to get through... They

didn't want him. "What they didn't take into account during Thursday's practice was that there was no adrenalin. He was hurting at Lord's but the adrenalin got him through. It would have got him through this

week as well." There were only three days between the end of the Edgbaston Test and Friday's start at Headingley and England captain Andrew Strauss told reporters after stumps on Sunday: "Hopefully we're in a better situation to get a result earlier for the final Test. "Flintoff's absence always causes a headache for England as they must then decide whether to play an extra bowler or an additional

At Headingley, they brought in another quick in Stephen Harmison only to be dismissed for 102 in their first innings on Friday after Strauss won the toss and elected to bat.

"When you haven't got an all-rounder in that number six or seven spot it is always a problem and one we are going to have to face up to because Flintoff is retiring from Test cricket," England coach Andy Flower, speaking after the end of the Headingley Test and before Monday's announcement, said.

"That is a problem because we seem to be either light on the batting side or the bowling side. "We will have to make a decision for the Oval -ifhe is not fit -- where we put our strength.

Flintoff, despite missing out at Headingley, remains second in England's series batting averages, behind Strauss, with 171 runs from five innings in three matches at an average of 42.75 and a best, made at Edgbaston, of 74.

But he has taken just seven wickets in the series at an expensive average of nearly 49, with most of those coming in his match-winning burst

at Lord's of five for 92. Anderson is England's joint leading wickettaker in the series, alongside Stuart Broad, with 12 wickets at 38,91 and a best of five for 80 at

Edgbaston. But, hampered by his injury, Anderson's 18

wicketless overs at Headingley cost 89 runs. Australia quicks Ben Hilfenhaus (18), Peter Siddle (16) and Mitchell Johnson (16) have all taken more wickets in the series so far than Anderson and Broad.

Steyn failed dope test

Cricket South Africa (CSA) has confirmed that Dale Steyn failed a dope test during the second IPL. It attributed the result to painkillers the fast bowler had taken during the tournament. Steyn was out of action for most of the IPL in South Africa in April-May due to a thumb injury and played only three matches for Bangalore Royal Challengers.

"We are aware of the result and submitted a report immediately to the IPL on why this has happened," Gerald Majola, CSA's chief executive told Cricinfo. "There was a marginal increase in the presence of morphine in the sample and that was due to painkillers he took during that period. We are awaiting a reply from the IPL authorities."

However, a Royal Challengers official said the franchise had no knowledge of this development. "Till Sunday night, Royal Challengers had no information or knowledge on this," Prakash Mirpuri, a vice-president of the UB Group, which owns the Bangalore franchise, told Cricinfo. "We can only comment if we receive official communication from CSA/IPL."

Dr Mohammad Moosajee, South Africa's team doctor and a member of CSA's medical commit tee, was confident Steyn wouldn't face any action despite the failed test, first reported by the sport24 website.

"This is not a doping violation as such but an adverse analytical finding, which is different, Moosajee told Cricinfo. "Dale is known to have a history of chronic migraines and he suffered a thumb injury too during the IPL and he was on Myprodol, a painkiller that contains codeine. Codeine converts to morphine within the body and that led to the adverse finding. Dale had taken the painkiller on the day of the test and the morphine level in his sample was found to be slightly higher (1.1 to 1.3 microgram per ml) than the 1 microgram per ml that is permitted.

Doping Agency (WADA) list of prohibited substances but morphine has been classified under Moosajee said there was some confusion

regarding the situation because the brand name of the painkiller is different in South Africa. "This also led to miscommunication in the Theraupatiuc Use Exemption (TUE) form that the player submitted before the test," Moosajee said. Players are expected to fill these TUE forms before a test so that the testers are aware of the medication the player is under.

Steyn is the second fast bowler to come under scrutiny for a failed drug test in the IPL; Pakistan's Mohammad Asif was banned for one year after testing positive for nandrolone, which is a banned substance, in the inaugural season in 2008.

In Asif's case, Lalit Modi, the IPL commissioner, had said that the first step was to match the identity of the player with the sample. Next, the player's form, filled out before the match, will be scrutinised for any pre-declared or prescribed drug by the IPL medical committee; if that matches the drug found in the sample, the matter ends there.

If the medical committee investigation reveals the player had not applied or been granted an exemption for using the drug found in the sample, the player, the concerned IPL franchise and national board will be informed in writing of the positive test that violates the anti-doping code. The player has the right to request that his 'B' sample (supplied at the same time as the one that tested positive) be sent for analysis, which he and his representative can attend along with an IPL

If that too is positive, the matter will be taken up by the IPL's drugs tribunal, which will study the issue and take a decision in accordance with the code.
