

# Implement RTI law properly for good governance

Speakers tell view exchange meeting

Speakers at a view exchange meeting in Rajshahi yesterday said a culture of seeking information should be developed in society, especially for the grassroots-level people, for effective implementation of the Right to Information (RTI) law.

RTI law would not leave any benefit unless it is properly implemented through creating awareness among mass people about their right of access to information, they added.

Once RTI is properly implemented, the speakers said, it would take the country a step forward to ensure good governance as well as administrative transparency and accountability.

They stressed the need for a strong role of the media in educating common people on appropriate methods of exercising their right.

Campaign for Right to Information (CFRTI) and local vernacular daily the Mukto Chetona jointly organised the meeting on RTI law and role of media in association with Asian Foundation at a city restaurant.

Fazl Hossain Badsha MP attended the meeting as the chief guest, while Liakat Ali Liku, chairman of the editorial board of the daily, was in the chair.

The lawmaker in his speech said the government is committed to implementing the RTI law, however challenging the task may be. He sought cooperation from all

circles related to RTI. "RTI is quite new to us when we are still fighting for the basic rights of ethnic groups... implementing a law is far more difficult than enacting it. Yet, if all concerned work together, we can well share the power with common people through implementing RTI."

CFRTI General Secretary Muhammad Lutful Haque presented a written paper on right to information and RTI laws while Staff Correspondent of The Daily Star Anwar Ali spoke on the role of media men in implementing RTI law.

CFRTI President Khondoker Iqbal Hossain and Mir Mostaque Ahmed of Asia Foundation were present at the programme as the special

guests.

Editor of the Mukto Chetona M Sadru Islam, News Editor Golam Sarwar, former president of Rajshahi Union of Journalists (RUJ) Mustafijur Rahman Khan Alam, RUJ General Secretary and Rajshahi bureau chief of the Shamakal Shibli Noman, Metropolitan Press Club Vice President Kazi Glas, General Secretary Anisuzzaman, BSS bureau chief Dr Aymal Haque and journalist Mahtab Uddin also spoke.

The speakers thanked the government for turning the RTI ordinance into a law, saying that lack of political will, culture of secrecy and lack of knowledge about RTI among general public are the main obstacles to implementing the law.

## Indefinite transport strike begins in Sherpur

Transport owners and workers enforced an indefinite transport strike in the district yesterday demanding removal of unauthorised ticket counters.

The transport leaders alleged that the bus owners from the nearby districts, including Dhaka, set up ticket counters here without their permission. In this situation, local transport are incurring loss, they said.

No vehicles, except a few BRTC buses, were seen plying throughout the district roads after enforcement of the strike.

Local transport leader Shawkat Hossain said they went on strike as the authorities concerned failed to take necessary steps to resolve the problem.

Police Super Anisur Rahman said they are trying to solve the crisis by holding talks with the association leaders.

Fazlul Haque, an eminent litterateur and journalist, passed away at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital (RMCH) on Thursday at the age of 63, says a press release.

Born on March 26 in 1946 in Pabna, Haque was the president of Rajshahi Sahitya Parishad. He also served as the principal of Rajshahi Sardar College until 1976.

Then he joined the Dainik Barta as its editorial assistant and later he served as the editor of the daily until 2000.

He left two daughters, a son and a host of relatives and well-wishers to mourn his death.

Rajshahi Mayor AHM Khairuzzaman Liton, lawmaker Fazle Hossain Badsha, local media houses and organisations expressed deep shock at his death.

His namaz-e-janaza was held yesterday and he will be buried today.

## AL activist electrocuted in Natore

An Awami League worker was killed and another injured with an electric shock while hanging the National Mourning Day banner with an electric pole in Natore town yesterday.

Kalu, 35, son of Batu Mia of Kandivita, died on the spot when he touched a live electric wire while hanging a banner near Chhayabani Cinema Hall intersection in the town.

Another AL worker Sadhan was critically injured. He was admitted to Natore sadar hospital.

Local Awami League leaders confirmed that they were their workers and went to hang the banner following their directives.

Just after the incident, police arrested Sa Hla Mong with the help of locals.

Police later sent Swe's body to Bandarban Sadar Hospital for autopsy.

The victim's relatives said Swe Mong was a guerrilla fighter of National United Party of Arakan (NUPA), a revolutionary group fighting against the military dictatorship in Myanmar. After the NUPA divided over some issues in 2005, he became a think tank member supporting the independence of Arakan state.

Swe Mong used to live in a rented thatched house in Maddhyampara with his wife and daughter, added his relatives.

The motive behind the killing is yet to be unearthed. However, locals doubted that his detachment from the party might be one of the reasons.

UNHCR Representative Khaing Mrat Kyaw and some other officials reached Bandarban to receive the body yesterday.

The UNHCR representative told The Daily Star that they would not take the incident lightly.

He expressed surprise on how an UNHCR refugee could be killed in public. He said they would make comment on the incident after receiving the autopsy and police report.

## Cop's wife commits suicide

The wife of a police sub-inspector (SI) committed suicide by hanging herself from a ceiling fan with a scarf at her Mohammadpur residence in the city yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Tanjila Islam, 25, wife of SI Mahbubul Alam Bhuiyan of Motijheel Police Station.

Mohammadpur police said the victim and her husband were living at a quarter in the residential complex of Mohammadpur Police Station for last two years.

Mahbub found Tanjila hanging from the fan in the drawing room around 2:00am and informed police of the incident, they added.

Mohammadpur police recovered the body from the residence in the morning and sent it to Dhaka Medical College for an autopsy.

Moonmoon Islam, the victim's sister, said a family feud was going on between Tanjila and her husband for long.

Tanjila and Mahbub got married in 2001 and they have a daughter and a son.

At around 9:30am students boycotted their scheduled examinations and came out in their hundreds. The examinees along with other students marched in a procession on the campus and challenged the authorities whether they had any legal authority to run the campus.

The protesters also hurled brickbats at police in retaliation. The chase and counter-chase that followed in the Talaimari areas left at least 35 students injured.

30, son of Md Galib of Rangpur, Shahidul Islam Chowdhury, 40, son of Shafiuallah of Chhagalnaiya, Shawkat Hossain, 34, son of Abdul Karim of Comilla, Alauddin, 25, son of Abu Bakar Siddique of Senbagh, Noakhali, and Nasir Hossain, 30, son of Mojibul Haque of Begumganj, Noakhali.

The rest of the deceased are yet to be identified.

The injured 11 passengers were admitted to Feni Sadar Hospital.

The wounded are Russell, 28, Md Alam, 40, Amjad Hossain, 21, Maman Hossain, 13, Nurul Islam, 45, Mahmuda, 32, Mohammad Ali, 29, Md Alim Maula, 50, Md Delwar Hossain, 24, Abul Hossain, 24, and another person who could not be

identified.

Resident Medical Officer of Feni Sadar Hospital Sarowar Jahan said the conditions of the people undergoing treatment are improving gradually.

Police and locals recovered the bodies and rescued the injured trapped inside the sunken bus.

Police recovered the wrecked bus and kept it at Mohipol Police checkpost in Feni.

COMILLA CRASH

In Comilla four members of a family were killed and seven others injured as a bus collided with a microbus at Nankara in Choudhogram upazila Friday, reports UNB.

The deceased were identified as Abul Hashem, 70, his wife Asia Begum, 60, son Abdul Jalil, 35, and daughter-

in-law Jahanara Begum, 40, wife of another son Abdul Barik.

Police said the bus heading for Comilla from Feni smashed the microbus, carrying six people of Hashem's family around 1:45pm, leaving three dead on the spot. Jahanara died on the way to hospital.
