

### GRAFT ALLEGATIONS Sircar files writ against JS body formation

Former speaker Jamiruddin Sircar yesterday filed a writ petition with the High Court (HC) challenging the formation of a parliamentary sub-committee to investigate graft allegations against him.

The BNP leader in his petition also prayed to the court to stay the proceedings and recommendations made by the parliamentary subcommittee against him.

The recommendations include cancellation of the House membership of Jamiruddin and legal actions against him on graft charges.

Sircar in his petition stated that the committee was not formed following the due process of the law, as no member of

# Job-based training mulled for youths

The government is to introduce several new training courses for youths to turn them into skilled workers for job markets both home and abroad.

These new proposed training include courses on AutoCad, dairy product processing and marketing, meat processing and slaughter house management, salesmanship, housekeeping, plumbing, rod binding and tiles fixing.

The Department of Youth Development (DYD) under the Ministry of Youth and Sports is to organise these training courses for youths between the ages of 18 and 35. Around 1,200 youths are expected to benefit from the diploma courses of three months to one-year duration.

The allocation of revenue budget is Tk 28.94 crore and development budget Tk 24.88 crore for the department in the fiscal year 2008-2009, a ministry official said.

Meanwhile, the government is to discontinue its six-month long stenotyping courses as typing posts have been cut down in both public and private sectors.

Golam Mahbub, Assistant Director of Dhaka district office of DYD, told The Daily Star "We plan to provide training on modern office management and computer applications instead."

The DYD also holds vocational and skill development training courses for the 4.50 crore youths of the country. The courses are designed to equip young people with skills to work efficiently both at home and abroad.

Courses include training on livestock, poultry, fishery and agriculture, aquaculture (fresh and coastal water),

basic computer skills, graphics and video editing, electronics, electrical wiring, refrigeration and air-conditioning, secretarial science, block, batik and screen printing and dress-making.

The department at present is also providing new courses for potential migrant workers. These include house-keeping and laundry operations, food and beverage service, pattern making, modern office management and computer application, poultry rearing, bird-flu control, bio-diversity management, mushroom production, hair dressing, sweater knitting, linking and sewing machine operating, English, Korean and Arabic languages etc.

The DYD has one national youth centre, 70 technical training centres, 55 livestock, poultry and pisciculture training

### VIOLATING OFFICIAL ORDER Govt to take action against ex-envoy Khairuzzaman

The government has decided to take punitive action against former high commissioner to Malaysia M Khairuzzaman for violating official orders to come back to Dhaka.

Khairuzzaman, who was implicated in the jail killing case of 1975 but later acquitted by the court, has been absconding since handing over his diplomatic charge following an official order to come back to Dhaka and join the foreign ministry.

The government will first issue a public notification against the former army officer-turned-diplomat, asking him why punitive action will not be taken against him, foreign ministry sources said.

Immediately after assuming office in January, the Awami League government asked Khairuzzaman to come back and join the foreign ministry, but he has been absconding since he handed over his charge on February 28.

The foreign ministry gave final orders asking Khairuzzaman to join the headquarters by March 7, but he did not comply with the government orders, which is a serious violation of service rule.

Rab official accused of 'crossfire threat'

An elderly woman yesterday alleged that the commanding officer of Rapid Action Battalion-1 sent her a threat to kill her son by putting him in so-called crossfire, in a sequel to a previous enmity.

Mahmuda Begum, 72, a resident of Darussalam area in the capital, made the allegation against Rab-1 Commanding Officer Maj Sumon Ahmed in a media briefing held at Dhaka Reporters' Unity, seeking government interference to save her son.

She said a few days ago a team of six to seven people identifying themselves as Rab-1 members went to her residence, searched it, and before leaving the house wanted to

# Democracy not practised within AL, BNP Shujan roundtable told

Two major political parties--Awami League (AL) and BNP--are not fostering intra-party democracy, which is an imperative to strengthen country's democracy, speakers at a round-table in the capital said yesterday.

They accused ruling AL-led government of turning the Election Commission (EC) into a 'paper tiger'.

Sushasen Jonno Nagorik (Sujan) organised the event titled "Reforms in the political party: Where we are" at the Jatiya Press Club.

On the much-talked-about political reforms, speakers said the issue drew huge public response during the tenure of the last caretaker government but they lost interest as soon as the then government adopted the 'minus two formula'.

They also apprehend that militancy will rise in the country if democracy does not prevail.

Presided over by Sujan president, the meeting was addressed, among others, by former adviser to the caretaker government and Sujan Vice-President ASM Shahjahan, AL lawmaker Shahiduzzaman Sarker, BNP lawmaker Amzad Hossein, ASM

# 41 die in Kuwait wedding inferno

Forty-one women and children were killed and dozens more injured when a fire ripped through a packed wedding party in Kuwait, triggering a panicked stampede, officials said yesterday.

Dozens of firefighters battled to douse the flames, which engulfed a large tent reserved for women during the wedding celebrations late on Saturday, in the worst civilian disaster in the modern history of the Gulf state.

"The total number of deaths reached 41. There were six children among them," Kuwaiti fire chief General Jassem al-Mansuri told AFP.


