Prime Minister and Leader of the House Sheikh Hasina and Opposition Leader and BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia will be invited in the meeting as the chief guest and special guest respectively.

Besides, UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon, US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, Chief of India's ruling Congress party Sonia Gandhi, Nobel laureate Prof Amartya Sen, noted international human rights activist Asma Jahangir and others dignitarles will be invited to attend the high-profile rally.

Those in Bangladesh who argue that the death four years ago of two Sundarbans tigers was due to reckless research have found support for their contention in the findings of an official Indian investigation into the deaths of Panna tigers in Madhya Pradesh. It is now thought increasingly likely that the deaths four years ago of two Sundarbans

tigers were the result of foreign researchers using radio collars as a way of tracking tigers in the forest. The researchers - a university of Minnesota professor James LD Smith and a PhD candidate Adam Barlow - were, at the time, working alongside the forest department as part of the Sundarbans Tiger Project. The researchers had

tranquilised and then collared two tigers one in 2005 and the other in 2006. The first tiger died within six months of radiocollaring. The second one died soon after being tranquilised to remove the collar.

The drive to recover shores, foreshores and channels of the five rivers around Dhaka will not resume until the demarcation of the rivers is complete, sources concerned said.

3,300MW more power by 2010

Move to build new power plants on urgent basis

BSS, Dhaka

The government has taken initiative to build new power plants on an urgent basis in both public and private sectors to meet the growing demand of electricity to be implemented under the supervision of the power division.

Bangladesh Power Development Board (PDB), as part of the move, has undertaken a massive initiative to set up new power plants with production capacity of 3,300 megawatt (MW) by 2010 in addition to the existing plants.

As per the new initiative, 500 to 1,500 MW rental power plants would be built which would go into production by 2010. Eight hundred megawatt would be generated by 2011 by setting up 10 power plants.

Worst carnage since US troops pulled out

A series of devastating attacks across Baghdad killed at least 75 people yesterday, in the worst day of carnage to hit the Iraqi capital since US troops pulled out of the conflict-hit nation's

Nearly 400 people were also wounded in two massive truck bombings outside government ministries, including one near the heavilyfortified Green Zone, a car bombing and a spate of mortar attacks.

February 2008, coinciding with the sixth anniversary of a truck bombing on the UN compound in Baghdad that killed UN special envoy Sergio Vieira de Mello and 21 other people.

"I was in my home with my family when the roof collapsed on us," said Hamid, 46, who lives a few hundred metres from the foreign ministry compound which was targeted along with the finance ministry.

"The government promised us security would return but where is the security?"

One of the truck bombs exploded outside the foreign ministry in a residential area close to the Green Zone sending plumes of smoke It was the bloodiest day in Iraq since and dust into the air, leaving a crater three metres (10 feet) deep and 10 metres in diameter

A shoot-out at a rundown building in downtown Kabul yesterday ended with police dragging down flights of stairs the bloodied and blackened corpses of Taliban militants who had stormed in hours earlier.
