

PM's help sought to bring back 80 workers from Saudi Arabia

Relatives of Bangladeshi migrant workers in Saudi Arabia yesterday urged the prime minister to help bring back 80 workers who have been waiting for return in a cell in Jeddah for around six months after serving different terms in jail.

At a press conference at the National Press Club in the city, they said the workers were sent to jail by the Saudi police in various times for violating very common rules or for expiry of visas.

When Saudi police presented them in the court, the workers had no scope for self-defence that ultimately led to sentences rang-

ing between six months and five years, said Mosharrar Hossain, one of the relatives, of Feni.

Mosharrar said those having passports, collected money from home and submitted it to the jail authorities to buy tickets, while those who do not have passports are issued special travel passes by the Bangladesh mission there.

"Sometimes the officials from Bangladesh embassy went there and assured the workers of sending them home in a week, but that week is yet to come," said Harun Or Rashid of Chittagong.

By this time, one of the victims, Mohammad Yusuf of Noakhali, also died in the cell, while others are having very bad times in frustration and diseases, he said.

Burglary at secy's flat

Burglars stole valuables, including gold ornaments and foreign currencies, from the government residence of secretary of the local government division at Dhanmondi in the city on Tuesday night.

Police said that the burglars entered into the flat of secretary Monzur Hossain cutting window grill on the first floor. None was at the flat on that night as family members went to Chittagong.

Burglars took away 25 tolas of gold ornaments, Tk 16,000 and US\$ 15,000, three mobile phone sets and two digital cameras from breaking open almaris at the flat, police said.

Police detained liftman of the building Masum Billah, a driver Waliullah, and brother of pump operator Shah Alam for interrogation.

A case was filed with Dhanmondi Police Station in this connection.

Incessant rain disrupts life in Ctg

Incessant rain disrupted normal life here in the port city yesterday.

The rain that began Wednesday afternoon inundated many of the city streets while commuters experienced immense suffering due to non-availability of transports.

City streets at several busy points like Bahodderhat, Muradpur, Sholoshahar Gate No 2, Agrabad Access Road and Badurtala went under knee-deep water creating serious gridlock in those areas at around noon.

The worst sufferers were the dwellers of low lying areas like Chwakhbazar, Bakalia, Kapashgola, Sholakhbazar, Agrabad CDA Residential area and Dewanbazar, which were submerged and inundated.

The met office recorded 195.6mm of rainfall in the last 24 hours till 3:00am yesterday.

However, no hill slides or casualty was reported till filing of this report at 5:15pm.

3 killed in road crashes

Three people were killed and 30 others injured in separate road accidents in Narsingdi and Barguna yesterday.

A correspondent in Narsingdi reports: Two people were killed and 30 others injured when a passenger bus collided head-on with a truck on Dhaka-Sylhet highway near Narayanpur Bus Stand at Belabo in the district yesterday.

The identity of the dead could not be known immediately.

The injured were rushed to different hospitals at Bhairab and Narsingdi.

Our correspondent in Barisal adds: A schoolboy was killed in a road accident in Barguna yesterday.

The victim was identified as Sabuj Reza, 16, son of Selim Molla and a student of class ten of Itabaria Charakgachhia School and College.

The accident took place near Sonakhali Girls School crossing at about 9:00am when a speeding bus

knocked the bicycle he was riding on while he was returning home from school.

He succumbed to his injuries on the way to Sher-e-Bangla Medical College Hospital.
