Info commission waits for office space, rules

The government has neither framed any rules nor set up an office for the Information Commission formed two months ago, which is delaying enforcement of the Right to Information Act, 2009 and depriving citizens of Star. information.

Failing to get an office, the commission recently started working temporarily at the National Institute of Mass Communications without any office staff or logistics support.

"We could not start working in full swing

mainly due to not having an office," said Chief Information Commissioner M Azizur Rahman. "We also do not have any manpower but we are going to NIMCO regularly to prepare the rooms provided to us for official use, holding meetings and doing the primary tasks," he told The Daily

Hundreds of people took position on the busy highway after Jum'a prayers at about 3:00pm disrupting traffic for three hours. A chase and counter chase

took place as police tried to disperse the protestors, leaving at least 10 people, including three policemen, injured.

The unruly mob pelted brickbats at the law enforcers during the melee and damaged six buses.

Later, three platoons of the law enforcers from Dhaka rushed to the spot and quelled the trouble.

Iran opposition leaders should be punished forunrest

Says Ahmadinejad AFP, Tehran

Iran's hardline President Mamoud Ahmadinejad called for the first time yesterday for the punishment of opposition leaders over the unrest unleashed by his disputed reelection.

"Serious confrontation should take place with the leaders and main instigators of the incidents. Those who provoked, organised and implemented the enemy's line should be confronted firmly," Ahmadinejad said in a speech at Tehran Friday prayers carried live on state radio.

It is the first time Ahmadinejad has made such a call against his political opponents, who have charged his re-election was fraudulent.
