

## Kimi wins Belgian GP

Finn Kimi Raikkonen rode his luck to claim Ferrari's first win this year when he held off a strong challenge from Force India's veteran Italian Giancarlo Fisichella in Sunday's dramatic Belgian Grand Prix.

It was the 2007 world champion's 18th career win but his first since the 2008 Spanish Grand Prix -- a welcome fillip for the Ferrari team after a torrid year. The race was overshadowed by a multiple accident on the opening lap which wrecked the hopes of drivers championship leader Jenson Button and defending champion and fellow Briton Lewis Hamilton, of McLaren Mercedes, both of them crashing out.

Fisichella, who had grabbed his Force India team's maiden pole position on Saturday, came home second, just nine-tenths of a second behind Raikkonen.

He scored the team's first points and first podium.

German Sebastian Vettel came home third for Red Bull to jump back up to third in the title race with 53 points behind Button on 72 and his Brawn GP teammate Brazilian Rubens Barrichello on 56 with five races remaining.

Pole Robert Kubica was fourth for BMW Sauber ahead of his team-mate German Nick Heidfeld with Finn Heikki Kovalainen sixth for McLaren Mercedes.

"We understand each other well and it will get better with more games."



## John calls for review

John Buchanan has called for a review of current Australian coach Tim Nielsen's position, in the aftermath of their 2-1 defeat in the Ashes. Nielsen had accepted responsibility for the outcome and had said there were things he could have done differently, but added that he had to concentrate on the job ahead. Buchanan, who coached Australia before Nielsen took over, stressed that it wasn't just the coaching position which had to be reviewed but the entire system.

"The coaching position needs to be looked at, whether we need a restructure of the position and the personnel," he told Australia's Herald Sun. "The first step is to deal with all the emotional criticism and then sit down and work out the best way forward."

"My view, having gone through it in 2005, was that there was a lot to be achieved, once you actually try to find solutions rather than looking for scapegoats. It's not just about the players. Some people have called for the selection panel to be looked at and I think we need to look at the whole system."

Nielsen began his tenure as coach successfully, with series wins over India and West Indies, in the early part of 2008. But, since then, Australia's record has been mixed. While they won against New Zealand at home and against South Africa away, they were defeated by India in the return series, experienced their first series loss at home in 16 years when they were beaten

2-1 by South Africa, and lost the Ashes. Buchanan said that Australia had not done well enough to monitor and study the opposition prior to taking them on.

He was speaking more with regards to their performance in England, having lost twice in two attempts there since 2005.

"We've lost two series in a row there now and even though we've got computer information on the opposition, we're probably not scouting as well as we could," he said. "It could be that we have a coach or somebody who follows the English team for a couple of months prior to an Ashes series."

"It could be that we talk to professional players or coaches who are already over there, about conditions and what the ball is doing. But we need to find long-term solutions."

Ricky Ponting, the Australia captain, has expressed his interest to come back to England in 2013 in the quest for an elusive victory under his leadership there, and Buchanan was fully supportive his ambition. However, he added that the coach needed to shoulder a greater element of responsibility in easing the burden off the captain.

"Ponting has said he wants to be there when they go back in 2013 and I support that, but I think the point it raises is the issue of player management," Buchanan said. "The captain doesn't have to be the first person to answer questions, but it would be a radical change to the traditional cricket hierarchy."

"Everything revolves around the captain and that makes the position extremely, extremely difficult to handle over a long period of time."

## BCCI snaps IMG ties

The Indian cricket board will no longer use the services of IMG, the sports management firm, for conducting the IPL, following a disagreement over payments for the league's second season in South Africa.

Srinivasan, the BCCI secretary, conveyed the decision only to Andrew Wildblood, the IMG vice-president, on Friday through a letter in which he explained that the Indian board's working committee felt that IMG's fee was "disproportionate to the service rendered". Srinivasan did not disclose IMG's fee for conducting and managing the IPL's second season but claimed that the BCCI had paid Rs 42.92 crore to the firm for the first edition in 2008.

Srinivasan claimed in the letter that he and Shashank Manohar, the BCCI president, had met Wildblood in London in June for negotiations on the issue and had asked IMG to submit a fresh fee proposal before the BCCI's next working committee on August 13. IMG failed to do so, Srinivasan claimed in the letter and concluded: "Therefore, please note that BCCI has taken a

decision not to use IMG service anymore for the IPL tournament."

When contacted, Srinivasan and Wildblood neither confirmed nor denied the development. "I would refrain from making a comment," Srinivasan said. "I am not able to make any comment at this time," Wildblood said. Lalit Modi, the IPL chairman, declined to comment too.

The IPL franchises were informed about the decision only on Saturday morning through a separate email sent by league officials, a franchise official confirmed.

Sources in the IPL governing council said they expected IMG to drag the Indian board to court over the issue, but the latest development is on expected lines as the payment to the sports management firm was a matter of debate within the BCCI last year too. One section of officials claimed that the fee was exorbitant and argued that IMG's role was over once the tournament was launched. Others have pointed to the crucial role played by the firm in conceptualizing, implementing and managing the league that has been widely acknowledged as a huge success; this is a view that has been backed by many franchise officials, one of whom said his team would always prefer to have independent professionals managing the IPL.

Gold medalists Mizanur Rahman and Rasiul Kabir were accorded a reception yesterday for their achievements in the 5th Korean Open International Taekwondo Championship in Korea.

Mizanur and Rasiul brought laurels to the nation in the under-87 kg and above-87 kg categories respectively in the championship, which is considered the fifth rated tournament after World Championship, Olympics, Asia and the USA meet.

Sports Minister Ahad Ali Sarker announced a cash reward of Tk 50,000 to each as incentive while Trust Bank, the sponsor of the Bangladesh Taekwondo Federation, also announced an incentive of Tk 1 lakh for each.

Both Mizanur and Rasiul said that they did not expect to clinch the gold, but this achievement would inspire them to do better in the 2010 South Asian Games at home as well as in the World Taekwondo Championship in Denmark in October.

With just 48 seconds gone Kaka, a 68.5-million-euro purchase from AC Milan, almost scored a debut goal but dragged his shot wide of the post.

Real's formation resembled a 4-2-2-2 but Ronaldo, sporting the number nine shirt, often roamed from the right into a central striker's role.

A minute after the interval Depor caught Real off-guard with veteran Valeron thundering a volley past Casillas to make it 2-2.

Ronaldo screamed a shot past the post with his supposedly weaker left foot before Diarra, hardly prolific in front of goal, fired in the winner.

## Australia post 145

Cameron White led Australia to 145 for four against England in the first Twenty20 international at Old Trafford on Sunday.


White, dropped on 12 by debutant Joe Denly, made 55 and shared a fourth-wicket stand of 78 with Michael Clarke, Australia's captain in the absence of the resting Ricky Ponting.

The duo came together after England captain Paul Collingwood took two wickets in three balls to leave Australia struggling at 54 for three in the ninth over.

Victoria's White, who didn't feature in the Ashes series that England clinched 2-1 at the Oval last week, completed a maiden fifty at this level off 33 balls when he launched paceman Ryan Sidebottom for his third.

He was eventually out when a lofted cover-drive off Ashes hero Stuart Broad was well caught by a leaping Collingwood in the penultimate over.

Clarke finished on 17 not out and Adam Voges was unbeaten on 11.
