# 5 special courts inactive

Five special courts dealing with some high profile corruption cases involving Niko, Gatco and Barapukuria coal mine now remain inactive as these cases have been transferred to other courts.

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) had filed the cases during the immediate past caretaker govern-

On December 22 last year, the law ministry issued a notification transferring the graft cases from the special court Nos. 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10, to the special court Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 in Dhaka.

All the 10 courts, which were set up on the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban premises during the now been shifted to the Dhaka Mosharraf Hossain at Special ACC authorities to take steps Judges' Court area.

ACC's panel lawyer Advocate Khurshid Alam Khan told The Daily Star that the court Nos. 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 have virtually nothing to do except send the persons convicted earlier by the same courts to jail on their surrender to the

These five courts now have no jurisdiction to carry out trial proceedings of any cases following the government notification, he said, adding that at least 50 high profile corruption cases, including Niko, Gatco and Barapukuria cases, had remained pending in these courts.

As a result, Khurshid Alam Khan said, he could not move a corruption case against former caretaker government, have BNP minister Khandaker



> According to laws, only the Metropolitan Senior Special Judge has the jurisdiction to send the cases pending with any special courts to another court, he said, adding that the High Court can also order any subordinate court to transfer any cases to another court

According to Section 4(3) of the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) Amendment Act 1958 only the Metropolitan Senior Special Judge may transfer, at any stage of the trial, any case from the court of one special judge to the court of another special judge having jurisdiction within the same territorial



#### Father seeks govt's help for release of convicted son

Garment exporter Sardar Mohammad Sharif, father of Ehsanul Islam Sadequee, who has been detained in solitary confinement in Atlanta, USA for more than three years for his alleged involvement in Pakistani militant group Lashkar-e-Taiba, yesterday demanded the government take necessary steps to free him immediately.

"I urge the prime minister to consider my appeal and take steps to rescue my son who is a victim of discrimination for being a Muslim," he said.

Sharif placed the demand at a press conference at the National Press Club in the city. Terming the charges

brought against Sadequee imaginary and false, he also urged different human rights organisations to support his call for a re-investigation of the case to dig out the truth. "The charges brought against

Sadequee have no legal basis and the members of Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) have been applying all sorts of face-saving tactics, including false propaganda against Sadequee," Sharif alleged. He claimed that the FBI

agents confined Sadequee and tortured him both physically and mentally. All sorts of ill treatments and abuse have been experimented on him which had made him a severe patient.

Sadequee, A Bangladeshi origin US citizen, was picked up by intelligence officials from Dhaka on April 17, 2006 and sent back to the US on April 21, 2009.

A US court in Atlanta on August 13, 2009 convicted him on terrorism-related charges, as he was found guilty on four counts of supporting terrorists and a foreign terrorist organisation after a seven-day trial, reports CNN from Georgia quoting a news release of Patrick Crosby, spokesperson for the US Attorney's Office.


