

## COPENHAGEN SUMMIT ON CLIMATE CHANGE

## Consensus among victim countries stressed

As the clock is steadily ticking down towards the final round of negotiation on climate change, experts and environment journalists of Asia and Pacific region in their congress in the city yesterday said the slow pace of progress in the negotiation process might jeopardise Copenhagen summit.

A consensus among the countries, worst or least victims of climate change, is needed for fruitful culmination of the negotiation process taking place over the last two years, they said.

Executive Secretary of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) in a message in the

congress also expected that the heads of state and government would provide clear political guidance to the negotiators of the coming sessions of the negotiations.

The three-day congress of the Asia-Pacific Forum of Environment Journalists (APFEJ) along with 5th meeting of the World Water Forum of Journalists (WWFJ) began at National Press Club with the theme 'Reaching Copenhagen climate summit and beyond: Role of media'.

Inaugurating the congress, Secretary of the Ministry of Environment and Forests (MOEF) Dr Mihir Kanti Majumder said, developed countries must take a lead to make the Copenhagen summit a success, as mitigation is

the only irreversible solution to climate change.

"No efforts to be taken by the developing or developed world will work if action to reduce the emission is taken as stated by the scientific community," he said.

Danish Ambassador Einar Hebergard Jensen and Dutch Ambassador Alphons Hennekens, Programme officer of the UNFCCC on Adaptation Festus Luboyera, attended the inaugural session as the special guests.

With chairman of APFEJ and Forum of Environment Journalists of Bangladesh (FEJB) Quamrul Islam Chowdhury in the chair, the function was addressed, among others by former Division Chief of UNESCAF Dr

Rezaul Karim, IPCC lead author Dr M Asaduzzaman and Indian Journalist Navo Joyti Thakuria.

Journalists from various countries in the Asia-Pacific region and host country Bangladesh are taking part in the congress being held in collaboration with FEJB and MOEF.

Danish Ambassador, as the host of the UNFCCC conference and COP15, described his country's arrangements and said Denmark is preparing to be the host one of the biggest international inter-government conference in his country's history.

"But, to make the conference success, we must forge a historic consensus for action," Jensen said adding "Denmark will listen carefully and mediate in the process towards a final agreement".

The Dutch Ambassador said the Copenhagen deal must be an equitable for all parties so that all countries are benefited from successful completion of the summit.

He said proper water management is the single and most important issue for both Bangladesh and Netherlands. Over the years both countries fought for protect land from river erosion, striving against salinity intrusion.

IPCC Lead author Dr Asaduzzaman was in favour of raising the voices of the most vulnerable countries at the current round of negotiation so that all their concerns can be addressed properly at the Copenhagen deal.

Quamrul Chowdhury called for launching a global climate bailout plan with US\$ 1 trillion for adaptation per annum to face adverse impacts of climate change by the most vulnerable countries like LDCs and SIDS. He also asked the journalists to play their role in this regard.

## Punishment to killers of Tamanna demanded

Bangladesh Mahila Parishad has demanded a fair investigation into the death of Dr Tamanna and exemplary punishment to those responsible for her death.

They alleged that the husband and mother-in-law of Tamanna often tortured her for dowry and they killed her.

Presided over by Sakina Ashraf, the rally was addressed by Parishad leaders Saraban Tahura, Rehana Yunus, Kaniz Fatema, Homaira Khatun and Asma Khatun.

## Bus strike in Rajshahi from today

Bus owners and transport workers in Rajshahi jointly enforced an indefinite strike in all routes from Rajshahi, including Dhaka coach services, demanding withdrawal of BRTC double decker busses from different upazila routes.

Rajshahi Sarak Paribahan Group and Rajshahi Sramik Union at a joint meeting took the decision last night, said Manjur Rahman Pitar, general secretary of the group.

The strike will be enforced from 5:00am today suspending all passenger bus services from Rajshahi.

"We go for the all out strike as our demands were left ignored for long time," Pitar said replying to a question.

He said the our main demand is to stop the BRTC double decker busses from different upazila routes in Rajshahi, as the service is not provided in other districts.

Other demands are -- shifting of the BRTC bus depot from middle of the city to elsewhere and stoppage of movement of shallow engine driven human haulers, he said.

Earlier, people from different sections in Rajshahi hold procession in support of running BRTC busses, as those are lower-cost transport.

## 'Save Boral, Chalan Beel'

Speakers at a seminar yesterday demanded steps to remove all the illegal embankments on the Boral to navigable the river and save Chalan Beel, the largest water body in the northern region.

They focused on the real picture of Chalan Beel region, urging the government to remove the illegal embankments to help regain the normal flow of the river and save the water body as well as its ecological balance.

Lawmakers, upazila chairmen, NGO personalities, political leaders and cross-section of people from 10 upazilas in the Chalan Beel region took part in the seminar jointly organised by Bangladesh Paribesh Andolon (Bapa) and Save Chalan Beel Movement at Chatmohar upazila parishad auditorium.

They vowed to save both the lifelines of the northern

districts.

Chairman of the parliamentary standing committee on land ministry AKM Mozammel Haque MP spoke at the programme as the chief guest, while lawmaker from Pabna-3 Md Makbul Hossain, lawmaker from Nator-4 Prof Abdul Kuddus were present as the special guests.

Chatmohar Upazila Parishad Chairman advocate Samsuddin Khabir chaired the discussion.

Mozammel stressed the need to remove the illegal embankments built on the Boral to make the river navigable.

Amzad Hossain Milon, chairman of Tarash upazila parishad, ABM Abdus Sattar, chairman of Raiganj UZ, Mohammed Ali, chairman of Gurudaspur UZ, Joint Secretary of Bapa also spoke.

The speakers said Chalan Beel region is one of the largest productive regions of the country. There are 12 rivers and

several tributaries here. Boral river is one of the largest rivers of Chalan Beel region. But the river has lost its heritage.

The river originated from Charghat point of the Padma river in Rajshahi.
