Advance bus-rail ticket for Eid now most sought-after item have also started collecting

With Eid-ul-Fitr drawing started thronging ticket counters at railway stations and bus and launch terminals to collect advance tickets to visit their village homes during the biggest religious festival.

The railway authorities routes. started selling advance tickets vesterday, but a small number of people collected tickets as only the tickets for September 14 were available.

Many others came to know when the tickets for other days, especially September 17, 18, 19 and 20, will be available.

"We have sold 916 tickets, out of 12,151, for September 14 and will continue to sell these tickets until September 14," said MA Zinnah, station manager of the Kamalapur Railway Station.

The tickets for September 15 will be available on September 8, tickets for September 16 on September 9, tickets for September 17 on September 10, tickets for September 18 on September 11, tickets for September 19 on September 12 and tickets for September 20 on September

Md Ahsan Habib, a resident of Mugda, came to the railway station to know about the advance tickets of Lamonirhat Express but went back disappointed, as only 14 tickets to Bogra for September 20 will be available.

There are only 440 seats in Lalmonirhat Express and only 14 seats are reserved for Bogra-bound passengers, he said.

Station Master of Kamalapur Railway Station Samsul Haque said there will be high demand for tickets for September 17, 18, 19 and 20. So, most people will collect

their tickets on September 10, Haque. 11, 12 and September 13.



Call to introduce Braille system in all educational instts

Speakers at a press conference yesterday urged the government to introduce Braille system in all institutions to ensure education for visually impaired people.

As most educational institutions, especially those in rural areas, have no such system the visually impaired children are deprived of education, they added.

Lamenting on the governwith Sightsavers International ment's attitude towards the people with disabilities, VIPS President Golam Mostafa suggested that like all other children, the children with disabilities should be brought under the education ministry instead of the social welfare materials for the visually ministry.

In fact, the government itself believes like other people in the society that the people with disability especially the visually impaired are

not capable of being established in the society, he said, adding that the government believes that mercy and kind-

ness are enough for them. Executive Director of the Centre for Disability in Development (CDD) AHM Noman Khan said educational impaired children are produced in the country but there is no proper distribution system on behalf of the government.

If the education ministry takes a comprehensive plan to provide education to children with disability including the visually impaired children then the problem will be solved to a large extent, he added.

Country Director of Sightsavers International Bangladesh Dr Wahidul Islam said the non-government organisations can make a model for providing education to visually impaired children but it should be the responsibility of the government to implement the model across the country.

"Education for visually impaired children is a must if the government wants to ensure education for all," he said stressing coordination between the ministries of education and social welfare.

In a keynote paper, VIPS General Secretary Mosharraff Hossain Majumder put forward some proposals including training for the teachers at primary, secondary and higher secondary level to handle the students with disabilities.
