

China coalmine blast kills 35, traps 44

An explosion at an illegal coalmine killed 35 miners in central China's Henan province yesterday and left another 44 men trapped, the government said.

An initial investigation showed that the mine in Pingdingshan city had been operating illegally at the time, the official Xinhua News Agency said. The mine's owners have been placed under police surveillance and the company's bank accounts have been frozen.

according to Xinhua. The pre-dawn explosion happened at Xinhua No. 4 pit, the State Administration of Work Safety said.

A statement on the administration's Web site did not give a reason for the blast. It said 14 miners fled to safety. There were 93 men working underground at the time, it said.

A staffer surmised Yue from the Pingdingshan work safety bureau said officials from the government's work safety office and the provincial government had arrived on the scene.

Calls to the local government and mine operators rang unanswered.

China's mines remain the world's deadliest, although the closing of many small, dangerous mines has halved

the average number of miners killed to about six a day in the first half of this year. Most accidents are blamed on failures to follow safety rules, including a lack of required ventilation or fire control equipment.

Henan provincial authorities have ordered a safety overhaul at all coalmines, with governments at city and county levels held responsible for safety at all pits in their jurisdictions, according to a circular issued Tuesday.

Pingdingshan city ordered all of the city's 157 coalmines to suspend production for a safety overhaul.

City authorities sent scores of people to take part in the search and rescue operation. Ventilation in most shafts has been restored, Xinhua said.

Indo-Bangla talks

While External Affairs Minister SM Krishna led the Indian team. The talks were preceded by a ten-minute one-to-one meeting between Moni and Krishna.

Giving a substantive start to her four-day visit to India, Moni and Krishna discussed the entire range of bilateral issues.

The meeting discussed the issues of cooperation in power sector, including import of power from India to Bangladesh and Indian assistance for upgrading our railway sector and procurement of locomotives, passenger coaches and buses.

The two sides also discussed easing of customs and immigration procedures of the passenger train Maitree Express, running between Dhaka and Kolkata, to make the service more popular.

They also discussed the possibility of Indian assistance for capital dredging of ports and rivers in Bangladesh to which Indian side expressed positive interest.

The two ministers also agreed to resolve the issues

relating to demarcation of the boundary between the two countries, including exchange of enclaves and adverse possession in a single package.

They also discussed the delimitation of maritime boundary and agreed that the issue should be settled to mutual satisfaction through negotiations.

The two countries also discussed in detail the issues relating to bilateral trade. The Indian side took note of greater market access of Bangladeshi products into Indian market by offering greater duty-free entry and removal of non-tariff and para-tariff barriers.

They also agreed to upgrade of infrastructure of the Land Customs Stations on both sides of the border for greater facilitation of trade. In this regard, both sides also discussed the possibility of easing visa procedures particularly for businessmen, patients, students and government officials.

Both sides also discussed the possibility of opening haats in bordering areas and

transportation of equipment for a power plant in Tripura through Ashuganj.

The two sides agreed that all issues would be addressed taking into consideration the aspirations and mutual benefit of the people of the two countries.

Moni invited Krishna to visit Bangladesh at his earliest convenience, which the Indian external affairs minister accepted.

Dipu Moni later called on Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh and met Finance Minister Pranab Mukherjee.

She is also scheduled to meet some other ministers, including water resources and power, in the next two days before wrapping up her visit to India.

Bangladeshi delegation at yesterday's talks consisted of Tariq Ahmed Karim, High Commissioner to India, Mijarul Quayes, Foreign Secretary, and other senior officials of the foreign ministry while Foreign Secretary Nirupama Rao and other senior officials assisted the Indian minister.

Licence for more TV channels soon

The government will issue licences to a number of television channels "as early as possible", Information Minister Abul Kalam Azad said in the House yesterday. He, however, did not specify the number of new channels.

Activities are underway to revise and amend "television code of advertising standards and practices" so that measures could be taken against "indecent and uncreative" advertisements in private TV channels, said Azad.

The minister said actions would be taken against a private TV channel if any lawmaker considers the contents of its talk show or programmes objectionable and reports to the ministry.

"A number of people submitted applications during the last caretaker government while many others after the present government assumed power, seeking permission for private TV channels. We will examine all those applications and issue a few licences," said the information minister.

Replying to lawmakers'

queries, Azad said the television code of advertising standards and practices are being updated. Actions would be taken if any TV channel failed to comply with the conditions for issuing the licence, he added.

"The existing rules are not enough to stop inappropriate and indecent advertisements," he said urging the satellite television channel owners and high officials not to broadcast any such advertisements.

In reply to a query of a lawmaker, whether the government is to stop controversial and provocative comments on religion or government in talk shows, the information minister said there is no such provision at present. "But we will make policy to this effect," he added.

The minister said, Bangladesh Television will keep monitoring the programmes of private television channels and actions would be taken based on that.

"The ministry will take measures if you (lawmakers) report to the ministry about objectionable programmes on television channels," he concluded while replying a supplementary question.

to empower the force to file cases against the criminals arrested by them and to investigate the cases.

It also held a talk with the leaders of Jatya Hindu Jote, a Hindu religion-based organisation, on whether there is any necessity to enact any law for mandatory registration of marriage, birth and death of the people of Hindu community, the commission official said.

The leaders of the Jote vehemently opposed the idea, saying that their community will face problem if any such law is enacted.

They, however, demanded enactment of a law to keep reserved seats in the parliament in proportion with the number of people of different religious communities, said the official.

Another official said the Law Commission, which was reconstituted through appointing its chairman and two members

after the present government's assumption of power, has been facing some problems, including shortage of manpower, funds and logistic support.

He said as there is no library in the commission, it cannot carry out any fruitful research for reform of any law which necessitates support of a well-stocked library having connection to foreign libraries.

The law ministry has rejected a request of the Law Commission regarding the appointment of a legislative draftsman for the commission, although it cannot undertake to draft any law without the help of a draftsman.

Last year, the government allotted Tk 93.04 lakh to the commission. This year the budgetary allocation was reduced to Tk 80.82 lakh only for payment of salary of all the officers and employees and to bear all other expenditures, the official added.

Swine flu to expose global health inequality: WHO

The global swine flu pandemic will expose the failure of the international community to invest in health protection in poor countries, the world's top health official warned here yesterday.

World Health Organisation director general Margaret Chan said the pandemic would "test the world on the issue of fairness," as she delivered an address to a meeting of Southeast Asian health ministers in Kathmandu.

"I believe it will reveal in a measurable and tragic way the consequences of decades of failure to invest adequately in

basic health systems and infrastructure," said Chan.

"It will show what the failure to care about equity in international policy really means in life and death terms."

At least 2,837 people around the world have died from the swine flu virus since it emerged in April, according to the latest WHO figures.

Southeast Asia, home to many of the world's poorest people, has so far been hit relatively lightly.

But Chan warned against complacency in the WHO's 11 Southeast Asian member countries -- Bangladesh, Bhutan, North

Korea, India, Indonesia, Maldives, Myanmar, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Thailand and East Timor.

"I can assure you, the pandemic will come to all your countries, and this is not the same as seasonal influenza," Chan told the gathered ministers, adding the pandemic would be "with us for quite some months to come."

The WHO said last month the virus had become the most prevalent flu strain.

Some tropical countries were already reporting "moderate strains" on their healthcare systems amid surges in infections, the UN health agency said.

Bridge faulty or the river?

As a result, a team of hydrograph experts from Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) measured both the river's water level and the height of the bridge from water level and found that it was only 13.2 metres instead of the required 15.2 metres.

Director of the Third Buriganga Bridge Project, Additional Chief Engineer of the Roads and Highways Department Faruque Ahmed, however, denied

floating the official height requirement and said the BIWTA officials have no right to measure the height of an under-construction bridge without prior permission of the project officials.

"They [BIWTA officials] have no idea about which navigation span of the bridge had to be measured for establishing the vertical clearance. We have con-

structed the bridge as per the terms and conditions of the project," he told The Daily Star.

BIWTA hydrographers, who measured the height of the bridge last week, said they had measured the vertical distance throughout the span of the bridge and found the range of clearance was between 7.9 and 8.53 meters

when at the current level of the river it should have been 10.5 metres.

The BIWTA officials said the contract requires the contractors to build the bridge at an even higher level. "We are now sure that the height requirement of the bridge has been badly negotiated and it will create big problems during flood when the government starts operating the circular waterway," said a BIWTA official, requesting anonymity.

As the floods increase the water level of the river, the vertical height clearance between the water and the bridge will decline.

The Bangladesh-China Friendship Bridge on Buriganga was built at a 40-metre height from water level while the Second Buriganga Bridge was built at 25 metres height.

The Dhaka Circular Waterway project combines river ways of Buriganga, Turag, Balu and Shitalakha and projects to establish a route that would help ease city's traffic congestion. In the first phase of the project, the government dredged the rivers and installed landing stations over an area of about 30 kilometres along the rivers. The second phase of the project is now underway.

Locals and an engineer of the contractor Mir Akhtar Hossain Ltd told The Daily Star that several components of the project were revised because of complications arising from land acquisition. But they said those revisions had nothing to do with the height of the bridge.

A former engineer of the Roads and Highways Department, who supervised constructions of several bridges, said negotiating height and width of bridges, which usually goes unnoticed, means corruption. "This is a practice that could save the people at the top engineering level of the project a lot of money," he said.

According to insiders, several bridges built elsewhere in the country will impede future navigability forever because of their low height. On the planned circular waterway, officials are already struggling with the vertical clearance of at least half a dozen bridges.

"Until we redesign these bridges and raise their heights we do not know how to run the circular waterway project," said an official of the Dhaka Circular Waterway Project.
