

Dhaka pushes for more jobs in KL

Seeks 'source country' status in Malaysia for regular manpower export

Bangladesh is negotiating with Malaysia to obtain "source country" status within a few months to export manpower there on a regular basis through a transparent system, according to the Bangladesh High Commissioner in Kuala Lumpur.

Bangladesh has been sending workers to Malaysia since the late 80s under special arrangements but it is yet to receive Malaysian "source country" status already obtained by India, Pakistan and

Workers are now sent to Malaysia on calling visas. This arrangement is hardly

favourable as they often get deprived of their rights and return home spending more money than what they earned there.

But once Bangladesh gets the "source country" status, the cost of migration to Malaysia will fall drastically and the workers will enjoy more rights than ever, said Bangladesh High Commissioner in Kuala Lumpur AKM Atiqur Rahman.

He said the human resources ministry of Malaysia has requested Bangladesh to follow a guideline "on the implementation of induction course and issuance of certificate of eligibility to foreign workers intending to work in Malaysia.

"It indicates that the Malaysian

authorities are positive about giving Bangladesh source country status," said the diplomat.

He also said the Malaysian government has been assessing the overall situa-

tion to decide on the matter. A number of workers said a syndicate of Bangladeshi and Malaysian manpower brokers does not want Bangladesh to obtain "source country" status.

Over four lakh Bangladeshi workers are now living legally in Malaysia. "Workers from source countries get

better facilities than their Bangladeshi counterparts. Those workers hardly face SEE PAGE 15 COL 4

Poor flock to city for work ahead of Eid

A large number of seasonal migrants are flocking to the capital ahead of Eid in search of work, contributing largely to the worsening traffic situation in the city.

The poor people come from different parts of the country in desperate bids to earn some extra money before the biggest religious festi-

Most of them are from low-income generating areas including Kurigram, Rangpur, Dinajpur, Jamalpur, Bogra, Mymensingh, Barisal, Sylhet, Kishoreganj -- all areas where

there is not enough work for the poor.

The migrants mostly work as rickshawpullers or drive autorickshaws and cabs. With little knowledge of different city streets and routes, and sometimes poor understanding of traffic rules, they end up deteriorating the city

Beggars of all ages have also poured into the city to make the best of Ramadan, when the faithful are more generous with their charity and the rich give out large sums from their Fitra or Zakat dues.

Indian ministers revolt over air travel in economy class

Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh has backed down after his cabinet revolted against an austerity drive that would have forced ministers to fly in economy class, reports said

Singh faced a barrage of complaints when he chaired his weekly meeting on Thursday over a series of cost-cutting steps outlined by the finance ministry on Monday, the Hindustan Times and other media reported.

The strategy includes cuts in funds earmarked for travel, furnishing for ministers' offices and residences, publicity work, as well

as seminars and workshops in luxury hotels.

The measures were imperative given a drought in large swathes of the country, which has pressured government revenues, a finance ministry statement said.

While ministers have heeded calls to cut down on foreign travel, the idea of taking economy class proved too much for many, the reports said.

Agriculture Minister Sharad Pawar said previous attempts to fly in coach had proved confusing, citing protocol problems when Russian officials in Moscow were alarmed that they were unable to find him in business class.
