# People with swine flu should stay at home: Experts

## Call for raising awareness to prevent spread of virus

Experts at a view exchange meeting vesterday said people affected with swine flu should keep themselves confined to their houses rather than going to their village home ahead of the Eid-ul-Fitr to avert further spreading of the virus.

"During this period bus and launch terminals as well as the railway stations are experiencing huge gathering. So those who have been suffering from severe flu or swine flu positive should not move outside as their travelling to be risky for others," said Dr M Mushtuq Husain, senior scientific officer of the Institute of Epidemiology, Disease Control and Research (IEDCR).
