"We are going to present our power generation roadmap in the meeting to apprise stakeholders, development partners and the media about the government initiatives and future plans, Mohammad Abul Kalam Azad, secretary of the Power Division, told BSS yesterday.

He said the present government has taken up a mega programme under which around 7,000 MW of electricity would be added to the national grid by the year 2014.

According to the Power Development Board (PDB), it has taken up some short term, mid term and long term plans to boost the power sector that was neglected for the last seven years.


