2 top officials' services extended

## 50 Taliban killed in Afghan clash, airstrikes

Up to 50 Taliban insurgents have been killed in Afghanistan's western Farah province after clashes that left seven Afghan and two US soldiers dead, government officials said yesterday.

Militants fired mortar rounds at a military-escorted convoy of humanitarian supplies in Farah province on Saturday, sparking clashes, explosions and an air strike by Nato forces helping fight a bloody Taliban insurgency here.

"The information we received from the ANA (Afghan National Army) is that in this clash seven ANA soldiers were killed and 12 were wounded," Farah governor Rohul Amin Amin told AFP.

"Around 40 to 50 Taliban were killed. Two American soldiers were killed. One Isaf vehicle was damaged," he said, referring to the Nato-led coalition, the International Security Assistance Force.

An ANA spokesman had already confirmed their soldiers' deaths, while a US Forces spokesman said on Saturday their two service members died in a blast in Farah, which has seen increasing levels of militant-linked unrest.

Local officials have also said that two women were killed in the same incident when one of the mortars fired by the Taliban struck their house.

## Mega transport plans rolled out in JS

Underground railway in Dhaka, tunnels under Padma, Karnaphuli, 142 new bridges

The government has taken up massive plans including construction of underground railroad across Dhaka city to ease traffic jam and installation of tunnels under the Padma and Karnaphuli rivers.

It also plans to build a total of 142 bridges to expand country's road and railway network.

Communications Minister Syed Abul Hossain presented the government plans

in parliament in reply to queries from several lawmakers.

Referring to the railway sector, he said the government has taken initiative to add 100 meter gauge coaches to Bangladesh railway.

He said the government is looking for foreign aid to implement 17 mega projects in the communications sector.

The minister told the House that the government has taken a set of measures to curb extortion in the transport sector.

The steps include engaging mobile courts and beefing up police patrol on highways.

In reply to a scripted question from BNP lawmaker Nilufar Chowdhury Moni, the communications minister said a process is underway to float tender for feasibility study for the underground railroad across Dhaka city.

He said the government has adopted plans to build flyovers at six level crossings in the city to ease tailbacks.

## 2 outlaws killed in 'crossfire'

Two top outlawed party leaders were shot dead in separate incidents of "crossfire" between police and their gangs in Kushtia early yesterday raising the number of such deaths to 21 in the district in last 17 days.

The dead were identified as Gono Bahini leader Marfat Hossain, 40, son of Ishaq Biswas of Ailchara in sadar upazila, and Gono Mukti Fouj leader Biplob, 33, son of late Tofazzel Hossain of Katakhana area in Kushtia district town.

A police team of sadar upazila conducted a raid in Ailchara village at around 3:30am when some Gono Bahini cadres led by Marfat were holding a meeting beneath the Ailchara Bari Bridge.

Police cordoned off the area and asked the outlaws to surrender but the operatives opened fire prompting the law enforcers to retaliate. The body of Marfat was found on the spot after his accomplices had escaped.

## BDR now seeks speedy trial

Govt may finalise trial process today

The director general of the paramilitary force sent a letter to the home ministry about their latest thoughts and requests, says a source.

Meanwhile, the government is likely to decide about the trial process of the BDR mutiny today, as the law ministry yesterday received the SC opinion on the presidential reference on the


