Tough time for home-goers

Thousands suffer from transport shortage, delayed trips, ticket crunch 3 days ahead of Eid

Thousands of home-bound people thronged launch, rail and bus terminals in the capital themselves of any transport.

Many along with family members were desperate for CNG-run auto-rickshaws or taxicabs in city streets. Those, who managed to find one, had to pay an exorbitant fare to reach destinations.

"I found a black taxicab after searching for about half an hour. The driver charged me Tk 150 for a ride from Science Laboratory intersection to Shyamoli while the usual fare is Tk 60," said Satkhira-bound passenger Farhana Ahmed.

Passengers bound for 23 south and southwestern districts suffered terribly as movement

burns down 11 CNG-run buses

A fire at the depot of a luxury commuter bus service destroyed 11 CNG-run buses at Anandapur in Savar yesterday.

Fire Service and Civil Defence officials said two fire engines from Savar station at 8:15am were able to move 12 buses of Trans Millennium Company Ltd to safety and put out the fire after a two-hour effort.

No casualties were reported, the officials said.

Police termed the incident mysterious and locals claimed most of the buses that were destroyed were out of service. Wheels of five of the destroyed buses were missing while most of them had their engines removed.

Police and fire officials said the fire broke out around 6:30am and destroyed the 11 out-of-service buses. "Cause of the fire could not be ascertained immediately," said

a fire official. "Leakage in the gas line and a spark of a battery could have triggered the fire," the official said.

Foreign Minister Dipu Moni said US-Bangladesh relationship had undergone a transformation--from aid dependence to an economic relationship that focuses on trade and investment. In this regard, she emphasised on the importance of duty

free, quota free access of the Bangladeshi products to the US market. The foreign minister was speaking at a discussion in

Washington DC on Thursday jointly organised by Paul H Nitze of Advance International Studies, John Hopkins University and US Bangladesh Advisory Council, said a press release.

Dipu Moni said Bangladesh is willing to play a complimentary role to the US efforts in handling the common challenges of today's world.

"Bangladesh could work with the United States in showcasing the progressive, liberal and democratic face of Bangladesh to the international community."

Shootouts' kill 2 criminals

An alleged criminal was killed in a 'shootout' between his cohorts and Rapid Action Battalion in the city's Mirpur area while an unidentified snatcher was killed in a 'shootout' with police in Chawgachha of Jessore early yesterday.

In Mirpur, Mohammad Ali, 25, an associate of top terror Shahor Ali, died in a gunfight with Rab-4 near Mirpur Outer Stadium around 2:45am.

Rab sources said some suspected persons being challenged by Rab opened fire at the law-enforcers who also retaliated with gunshots in the stadium area. Mohammad Ali died on the spot.

An Awami League leader of Bagmara, who possesses two small industries and ancestral property, managed to get lease of a piece of government land (Khas land), depriving the genuine landless people.




Locals said Razzak has long been trying to grab the land by living in a temporary house there. After Awami League came to power, he applied for a lease of the land.


