# Highway cops limp

Manpower, transport shortage leaves them in a fragile state

The highway police department tasked with curbing crimes and helping victims in road mishaps is now limping because of inadequate manpower and poor logistic support.

The department has to keep a close watch on a stretch of 11,806-kilometre highway with only 2,042 personnel posted at 24 police stations and 48 outposts across the country.

These police stations and outposts have only 76 patrol cars including jeeps, pickups and minibuses, 40 walkie-talkies and 151 motorcycles to discharge their duties throughout the country.

On an average, each highway police station or outpost has a 160-km-long stretch of road. The highway department has a total of 11,806-km road -- 7,641 km

national and 4,165 km regional.

A highway police station or an outpost can afford only one patrol team consisted of 15 to 20 people with one patrol car to keep vigil over its designated area in three shifts.

The highway patrol is of no use to people as a patrol car, in reality, do very little to protect people on a 160-km-long road. As the lone patrol car moves from one end to the other leaving behind the entire stretch unprotected, criminals very easily swoop on their prey.

The western region of highway police in Bogra has 10 police stations and 18 outposts in its three zones-- Bogra, Kushtia and Gauranadi while eastern region in Comilla has 14 police stations and 30 outposts in four zones--Comilla, Chittagong and Sylhet.

The department came into being on

June 11 of 2005 but most of its police stations and outposts are housed in abandoned sheds of highway construction workers or rented houses except for eight makeshift structures of its own -- four for police stations and eight for outposts.

Very often highway police personnel have to play a role of mere bystanders as they do have no wreckers or other logistic supports to conduct rescue operations after road mishaps. They even cannot cope with highway robbers as they use faster means of transport.

Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Sohrab Hossain, chief of the highway police, said dual administration often causes dilemma in discharging duties on the highway, widening the scope for law enforcers to indulge in irregularities.

Hossain said traffic police and thana

## Suicide attack kills 33 in Pakistan market

A suicide car bomb tore through a Pakistan market, killing 33 people and trapping victims under smashed shops yesterday as families bought supplies for a major religious festival, police said.

The explosion flung body parts across the bazaar and gutted shops in Ustarzai, a small mainly Shia northwest town which lies between the garrison city of Kohat and Hangu,

another town with a history of sectarian unrest.

A spokesman for the little known Lashkar-i-Jhangvi al Almi militant group claimed the attack Northwest Pakistan is rife with sectarian violence and Islamist militants, branded by the United States as an existential threat.

The area was packed with shoppers buying food and delicacies for the weekend and the Muslim Eid-ul-Fitr holiday, which Pakistanis expect to start on Monday with the sighting of
