#### Aman lands in jail

Case filed by party colleagues; Delwar demands release

The Detective Branch of police yesterday arrested former BNP state minister Amanullah Aman at Zia International Airport in an attemptto-murder case filed by one of his party colleagues.

The formar student leader was held as soon as he got off a Thai Airways flight from Singapore at around 1:30pm. Police took him straight to a Dhaka court which sen

him to jail.

The arrest sparked fierce demonstrations by a group of BNP activists disrupting traffic on Airport Road for about an hour.

Police charged baton to disperse the stone-throwing protesters, said witnesses.

Vehicular movement on the busy thoroughfare returned to normalcy at around 2:30pm.

Police sought a 10-day remand for quizzing Aman. But as SEE PAGE 12 COL 8

#### 11 doctors dismissed

They term politically motivated

Ten professors and an associate professor of different departments of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU), the lone medical university in the country, were dismissed yesterday for their alleged political affiliation.

University Registrar Abdul Gafur who served the termination letter to those teachers told The Daily Star the eleven were relieved of their jobs because their appointments flouted the Public Servants (retirements) Act, 1974 that prohibited the recruitment of retired government officials as permanent employees.

He also said the act states that the retired persons could join any autonomous institute on a contract basis but they cannot be made permanent. The dismissal orders come into effect from today.

Those who were terminated are Sayeba Akhter and Nasim Akhter Chowdhury of Gynaecology Department, Jahangir Kabir of Nephrology, SA Khan of Transplant Urology, Matiur Rahman Mollah of Dental, Abul Kashem Chowdhury of Microbiology, SEE PAGE 15 COL 8

Farcical arbitration let 16 culprits get away with fine of Tk 10,000 each; victim's poor father dares not to file case

ernment is not paying attention to public welfare nor fulfilling Ten activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) allegedly gang-raped a teenage girl Friday night and were later handed down mere punishment at village arbitration arranged to ensure their escape by local Awami League leaders.

Family sources say the AL leaders compelled the victim's father not to go for legal action and also took their signatures on three blank sheets

to stop any future move to that end. Police also released two of the accused held

on the spot while handing the victim over to her father early Saturday morning. A band of 16 youths kidnapped the girl, a

class VII student of Pakhimara in Kalapara upazila, Friday night when she was returning home on a rickshaw from a Puja mandap with her cousin Nasir Uddin.

The BCL men beat up Nasir, drove him away and took the girl to a nearby garden. Ten of them raped the girl until her relatives with

police rushed to the scene to rescue her around 2:00am. Sub-inspector Kabir Hossain of Kalapara police station held two of the culprits -- Rajib and Sohag -- from the spot but freed them later

after handing over the girl to her family. Later on Sunday, local AL leaders including Kalapara upazila unit Secretary Rakibul Ahsan
