

Deadly tsunami strikes in Pacific

113 killed; thousands flee to high grounds; 8-magnitude undersea quake recorded

Towering tsunamis churned up by a huge earthquake slammed into the Samoa islands on Tuesday, killing at least 113 people as they wiped out entire villages and flattened tourist resorts.

Monster waves that witnesses and officials said measured between three and 7.5 metres high pounded the remote Pacific islands of Samoa and Western Samoa after an 8.0-magnitude undersea quake struck in the early morning.

While the quake toppled buildings and sent thousands fleeing to high ground as the tsunami approached, many others were hit by the walls of water that swept people and cars out to sea and obliterated coastal settlements.

US President Barack Obama called the incident in the outlying US territory of American Samoa a "major disaster" and vowed "aggressive" action to help survivors.

"I am closely monitoring these tragic events, and have declared a major disaster for American Samoa, which will provide the tools necessary for a full, swift and aggressive response," he said.

Samoa's Prime Minister Tuilaepa Sailele Malielegaoi said he was "shocked beyond belief".

"So much has gone. So many people are gone," he told the Australian news agency AAP. "I'm so shocked, so saddened by all the loss."

The tsunamis swept across the Pacific, battering Samoa where hospital workers said it killed at least 84 people, American

DCC in hibernation as dengue spreads again

No drive in years for lack of manpower, equipment, low infection rate

Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) has not carried out any special preventive drive against dengue fever in the past 4-5 years attributing it to low incidence of the disease, and inadequate manpower and equipment.

Medical experts say dengue is an endemic disease and an annual phenomenon.

The DCC has not procured any larvicide in the current fiscal year and has decided not to clean up mosquito breeding grounds under the jurisdiction of other agencies.

"We have not carried out any special

drive to eradicate larvae of Aedes mosquito (Aedes causes dengue) as incidence of dengue fever came down in the last few years," said DCC Mayor Sadeque Hossain Khoka.

The DCC conducted routine anti-mosquito drives during the period but no drive only aimed at preventing outbreak of dengue. But special drives were launched in areas with identified dengue cases, the mayor said when contacted.

He said the DCC faces audit objection if it spends money on cleaning up water bodies owned by other organisations.

Meanwhile, the DCC Advisory Committee on Cleanliness and Mosquito Control sits today with the health minister, lawmakers from Dhaka and civil

society representatives to chalk out an awareness building action plan concerning dengue for the current year.

"We will launch the awareness drive on Friday," said Khoka.

Another BDR jawan dies at Ctg hospital

Another BDR jawan 'died of severe chest pain' yesterday at Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH), raising the BDR death toll to 47 since the BDR mutiny on February 25-26.

The deceased was identified as lance nayek Abul Khayer, 38, of BDR Training Centre at Satkania, reports our Chittagong Office.

Khayer, hailed from Panchbibi upazila of Joypurhat district, was earlier sent to Chittagong Central Jail after his arrest on May 13 this year in connection with the mutiny at BDR Training Centre of Baitul Ijrat in Satkania.

BDR MEN'S UNNATURAL DEATHS Probe body fails to submit report again

A home ministry committee investigating the reasons behind the rising number of "unnatural" deaths of BDR personnel in custody has once again failed to submit its report and sought time extension for the fifth time.

The figure of custodial death has reached 47, but the committee has made little headway in its investigation in the last four and a half months since its formation on May 14. The latest deadline for submitting its report expired September 16.

The ministry has not yet approved the time extension petition. Head of the committee Zakir Hossain, however, claimed that they had been allowed one more month to finish the probe.

Meanwhile, the investigation officer of the cases filed in connection with the February 25-26 mutiny and murders at the BDR headquarters did not submit the probe report to the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's court on the scheduled date yesterday. The IO also did not inform the court about the reasons for his failure.
