Crushing in sugar mills starts in Nov

Crushing of sugarcane in 15 state-run sugar mills in the country will begin next month, Bangladesh Sugar and Food Industries Corporation (BSFIC) sources said.

BSFIC has fixed a target to produce 1,01,525 metric tons of sugar by crushing 13.30 lakh metric tons of sugarcane this fiscal. The rate of sugar production is expected to be 7.63 percent.

The crushing target was 22.72 lakh metric tons while target of sugar production was 1,73,100 metric tons during the last fiscal. BSFIC has proposed that the

sugar mills will buy per maund (37 kg) sugarcane at Tk 66 while the rate was Tk 60 last year, sources said. The price of sugarcane has been fixed so that the farmers can get fair price.

This year sugarcane was cultivated on 1,28,580 hectares of land under the management of the BFSIC
