The UGC introduced the award in 1980 to encourage university teachers to do fundamental research works, Prof Shibly said.

Asked whether the research works are being done in a lower scale at the private universities since only three private university teachers have won the award, Prof Dr Ehsanul Haque, another member of UGC, said there are not adequate facilities for doing researches in the private

"I think private universities are relatively new and are not matured enough compared to the public universities and many public university teachers take classes in the private universities," he said.

Besides, private universities are not allowed to offer PhDs due to lack of facilities, he said.

However, he is hopeful the facilities would be developed in course of time.

Three people, including a son of former BNP lawmaker Hafiz Ibrahim, were arrested from the city's Gulshan area on charge of assaulting three policemen early yesterday. Police also seized cars of

Police said Maruf Ibrahim, son of Hafiz Ibrahim, along with his friends, was going to Gulshan-2 by a car from Gulshan Circle-1 through Gulshan Avenue at about 1:30am on Sunday. At one stage, Maruf and

his friend locked into an altercation with a taxicab driver near Gulshan Circle-2 as their vehicle hit the cab from behind. A patrol police team com-

prising three rushed to the spot and tried to settle the matter.

In the meantime, Hafiz Ibrahim along with his several friends reached the spot following information from his son and attacked the policemen and the cabby.

On information, police rescued the injured driver and policemen -- Constable Saheed, Nayek Anis and Nayek Kashem -- and rushed them to Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Hafiz and his friends fled the scene, leaving behind his car, says a witness.

Police arrested Maruf Ibrahim, one of his friends and his driver and seized two cars.
