Govt to go after jam in a big way

PM says coordinated communication network to ease traffic jam, 4 adjacent districts to be incorporated; vows to explore Bay

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday told parliament the government is working out plans for an extensive and coordinated communications network to ease traffic congestions in the capital.

"We are now drawing routes for the elevated expressway in the capital. We also have plans to construct underground railway and monorail to cut tailbacks," she said during the question-answer hour.

The prime minister said the communications plans being mapped out for the city will incorporate the adjacent districts--Gazipur, Narayanganj, Munshiganj and Manikganj.

She said the construction of a four-lane Dhaka-Chittagong highway may begin in December and end by December 2012.

The tenders submitted for the work to upgrade the two-lane Dhaka-Chittagong highway into a four-lane are now awaiting evaluation.

"The highway will be made a six-lane thruway once the country joins the proposed Asian Highway," she said.

In response to some lawmakers voicing concern over the worsening traffic situation in the city, the prime minister also spoke of plans to construct car parks and more roads.

The other measures under consideration include increasing the number of traffic police and introducing staggered

timetables for private, autonomous and semi-autonomous organisations and educational institutions.

She urged the private schools to run enough bus services for their students to obviate the need for using private cars.

Hasina called on the drivers to abide by the traffic rules.

Stressing the need for constructing car parks, she said the city streets are wide, but that does not mean they have space enough to allow on-road parking.

Talking about reasons for the dismal traffic situation, the prime minister said, "It's quite natural that population and the number of vehicles will rise with time. The problem lies with un planned

The project to upgrade the narrow but crucial Dhaka-Chittagong highway to a dual carriageway has finally got momentum as the officials concerned expect to complete all procedures by December.

A seven-member evaluation committee is now scrutinising 111 tender documents submitted by 18 local and international firms for the Tk 2,404 crore project.

"Evaluation of the documents will be completed in a week and a report with the names of successful bidders will be sent to the communications ministry for approval," said Project Director Md Sabir Hossain Khan, who is an executive engineer of Roads and Highways.

A notification of award is likely to be announced next

Govt plans for experts body to assess Tipai

Stresses talks with neighbours to solve problems

Formation of an expert committee to assess the possible impact of the proposed Tipaimukh Dam on Bangladesh is under consideration, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said yesterday in parliament.

In its report to the parliament yesterday, the parliamentary delegation, which visited the controversial Tipaimukh Dam site, suggested

the formation of the expert team to conduct a survey and assess the advantages and the overall impact of the dam on Bangladesh.

However, the prime minister said the expert team would be formed after examining the information and data already available on Tipaimukh Dam and those to be available in future.

During the question-answer hour in the Parliament, Hasina said, "The government is
