58 DAYS INTO SPECIAL DRIVE IN SOUTHWEST Shootouts kill 63, criminals 29

The joint special drive of police and Rapid Action Battalion in the outlaw infested southwestern region has seen 63 deaths in "crossfire" and "shootouts" in 58 days as of yesterday.

Out of 63 criminals that died in such incidents in 10 districts of Khulna division, 25 died in Kushtia alone as of October 18, the highest number of deaths in a district, says Rab statistics.

Interestingly, only 11 deaths in shootouts occurred in the region during January 1-August 21 before the drive began on August 22.

Since the drive began, police and Rab have

claimed that these incidents of shootouts took place between them and accomplices of alleged criminals, most of whom are members of different banned outfits.

Meanwhile, criminals have killed at least 29 persons in these 10 districts since the drive was launched two days after the inspector general of police and the Rab director general's visit to Kushtia.

Police and Rab officials in the district, however, said the number of killings in the last 56 days is "significantly lower" compared to the total 285 murders since January 1.

Outlaw killed in 'shootout'

An outlaw was killed in a 'shootout' between his cohorts and police in Chatmohor upazila in Pabna yesterday.

The dead was identified as Jamal Uddin, 38, a regional leader of Purba Banglar Communist Party (PBCP-Janajuddha).

Acting on a tip-off, Chatmohor police raided Kutibari Battala where the outlaws were holding a meeting around 3:00am.

Sensing their presence, the Janajuddha cadres opened fire forcing the law enforcers to retaliate.

They urged him to ensure regular holding of the House body's meeting to make it functional, committee sources said.

Formed on February 18, the Pac held its third meeting yesterday with the second one held on May 25. The committee has made little progress in performing its task of ensuring transparency in government expenditure.

At yesterday's meeting, committee member Ali Ashraf raised the issue of non-holding of its meeting, and said it should sit regularly, even everyday, since it has huge tasks, meeting sources said.

DRIVE TO FREE SHITALAKHYA Traders given 2 days to remove sand

Authorities have removed around thirty makeshift structures from the west foreshore of the river Shitalakhya and ordered unauthorised sand traders to remove earth filling within two days during an eviction drive yesterday.

Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) and Narayanganj district

administration conducted the drive that started around 11:00am to free the riverbank from sand filling near Kanchpur Bridge in Shimrajal mouza.

"The sand traders were given a two-day notification to remove the earth filling or else the authorities will arrange an auction," said BIWTA Deputy Director Alamgir Kabir.

Twin bombs kill 7 at Islamabad university 20 militants killed in offensive, over 1 lakh displaced

A double suicide bombing at a university campus in Pakistan's capital yesterday killed up to seven people, including the two bombers, an administration official said.

"Seven people, including two suicide bombers are dead, and 29 injured in the two attacks. Among the dead is one female," a senior

administration official, Rana Akbar Hayat told AFP at the scene of the attack.

Police investigators confirmed that both were suicide attacks.

Meanwhile, Pakistani troops and Taliban fighters were locked in fierce clashes in a major offensive that officials said had killed more than 100 people and uprooted 110,000.
