## Qureshi blames US for rise of terrorism in Pakistan

'Soft target' Karachi Port next on terror hit list: Intelligence report

Pakistan Foreign Minister Shah Mehmood Qureshi has blamed the United States for the rise of terrorism in

a press conference at the Multan Airport, Qureshi held America responsible for the continuous spate of violence in the

Americans that they are responsible for this problem. They established training camps and created Mujahideen to disintegrate Russia. When it collapsed, they left and we fell prey to the menace of terrorism," The Nation quoted Qureshi, as saying.

Qureshi said that the issue of terrorism needed a regional-level solution and urged countries like Afghanistan and Iran to support Pakistan in its effort to fight the menace.

Commenting on the on-going military offensive in South Waziristan, the strong-

"We're not bound to accept any "We've made it clear to the American condition. But we need their support to defeat terrorists. That's why we'll have to improve our relations with the Americans instead of deteriorating them," he said.

Pakistan's nuclear arsenal by militants as also the proliferation threat from those directly engaged in Islamabad's weapons programme, Secretary of State Hillary Clinton has said.

But Washington does not think recent militant attacks in Pakistan including the one on its military headquarters 'pose a threat to the nuclear command and control or access,' she said in an address on non-proliferation issues at the US Institute of Peace think tank Wednesday.

"But we have certainly made our views known and asked a lot of questions and are supporting the Pakistani Government in their courageous efforts against these extremists, which, to us, is one of the most important steps they can take," Hillary said.

Underling Obama administration's concerns about the safety of Pakistan's nuclear weapons and nuclear proliferation through the notorious AQ Khan network, she said, 'those two concerns are part of each and every engagement that we have.'

Taposh is the son of Sheikh Fazlul Haq Moni, nephew of Bangabandhu, who was slain on August 15, 1975, along with other family members of Bangabandhu.

The Bangabandhu murder case had remained stalled for seven years since 2001 as the killers had strong political backing. The proceedings of the case resumed recently after the Awami League came

Investigators say supporters of Bangabandhu's killers or their Freedom Party might have launched the attack not just to kill Taposh, but also to create a panicking situation either to delay or foil the trial.

Another motive behind the attack could be conflicts within the Awami League although there has been no report of such extreme intraparty feud that may prompt such an incident.

In another reasoning, investigators suspect a link between the attack and the February 25-26 BDR mutiny.

Taposh drew attention of many when it was reported that a few BDR personnel held meetings with some political leaders including him before the mutiny. After the mutiny was over, a section of aggrieved persons pointed fingers at Taposh and some other ruling party politicians, accusing them of instigating the mutiny.

Investigators say some people could have attacked Taposh out of such grievances, justified or not.

Additional Director General of Rapid Action Battalion Mizanur Rahman Khan notes that this is an early stage to give hints about the attackers. "We may start with analysing the target [Taposh] We are investigating the matter thoroughly," he said.

Meanwhile, bomb experts have collected evidence from the attack site at Motifheel. Some evidence is being tested at laboratory. It is thought that the bomb was manufactured locally using ammonium nitrate, an element commonly used by the JMB. But the banned militant outfit also uses an electric circuit in their bombs, which was not present in the bomb used in the attack on Taposh.

Rab Deputy Director of Bomb Squad Maj Momtazur Rahman told The Daily Star, "There is not enough evidence at the attack site to draw a clear-cut conclusion at this stage. We can only say the bomb was somewhat powerful. It may have been manufactured with 200-500 grams

of explosives." Another investigator said some clues might have been lost since the crime scene was

not properly preserved. In a bid to find out the motive behind the attack, the

investigators are considering the number of different groups that might have targeted a politician like Taposh. "We have some good idea

that the attack was not due to any personal conflict with Taposh. The motive is something external," said a source. Another issue to investi-

gate is whether the bomb was hurled at Taposh's car or planted on it. The primary impression is that since no electronic or electric circuit was found at the site, it might have been thrown at the car.

Bangladesh saw its first terrorist bomb attack back in 1999 on a cultural event of Udichi. It was followed by several bomb attacks--all on gatherings of either the Awami League or cultural or secular groups. In August 2005, the JMB announced its widespread presence with countrywide bomb attacks. On November 14, 2005, the outfit launched its last attack in Jhalakathi and killed two judges. Ever since the law enforcers have kept them on

the run. On the other hand, the killers of Bangabandhu had political support from Ziaur Rahman's regime until Hasina assumed power in 1996 and again during the BNP-Jamaat alliance's rule from 2001 to 2006. The killers also had support from different foreign countries.

District administration sources said, the sand and stones kept under the Kanchpur Bridge would be auctioned Monday.

District administration and BIWTA conducted a drive led by First Class Magistrate Shamsuzzoha to evict the illegal grabbers from Kanchpur area yesterday noon. A good number of Rab and police members were deployed during the drive.

BIWTA authorities using hand mike announced that no ship or river vessel could be loaded or unloaded at Kanchpur Bridge area in next seven days. Sand, stones or any struc-

tures kept under the bridge illegally would have to be removed by Sunday. Otherwise the district

administration would auction the goods. Advertisement would be placed in local newspapers in this regard, Magistrate Shamsuzzoha said.

On a spot visit to Kanchpur Bridge area it was found the river has been filled with earth from the guide wall on the west side to the pillar no 4 of the bridge. Huge amount of sand and stones have been piled up on the banks of the river.

Alamgir Kabir, deputy director Narayanganj River Port, said if the grabbers did not remove their goods by the deadline legal action would be taken against them.

Major anti-Taliban offensive goes on in northwest

Suspected militants on a motorbike shot and killed a top Pakistan army official along with another army man in Islamabad yesterday, striking at security forces as they pressed ahead with a major anti-Taliban offensive inthenorthwest

The assault in Islamabad showed the insurgents are able to hit the heart of the country despite ramped up security and deploy diverse tactics in their fight.

Deputy Director General Military Operations

Brigadier Moin was killed along with another official when unidentified gunmen opened fire at the military jeep in which they were travelling.

Brigadier Moin is believed to have been involved in the strategy making for the on-going offensive in South Waziristan as well as the Swat operation, The Dawn reports. The offensive in South Wazirstan is considered a

critical test of the nuclear-armed Pakistan's campaign against Islamist extremists aiming to overthrow the state and involved in attacks on Western forces in neighbouring Afghanistan.

### Jasim mulls legal action
