"This year he has also cemented his reputation as one of the most accomplished captains in world cricket currently."  
Vettori had led his team by example, with his Test feats including taking six wickets in an innings against the West Indies, and a century against India.  
Later in the year the 30-year-old -- who made his Test debut aged 18 -- scored 140 against Sri Lanka and joined the elite club of Test players with 300 wickets and 3,000 runs.  
Jesse Ryder won the first class batting award after scoring his maiden Test century and then a double ton against India, which gave him a 2008-09 season Test average of 55.  
The outstanding one-day international batting performance award went to Martin Gupthill, who scored 122 on his debut against the West Indies.  
The one-day bowling award went to Kyle Mills, whose successes included taking a match-winning four for 35 against Australia in Perth.

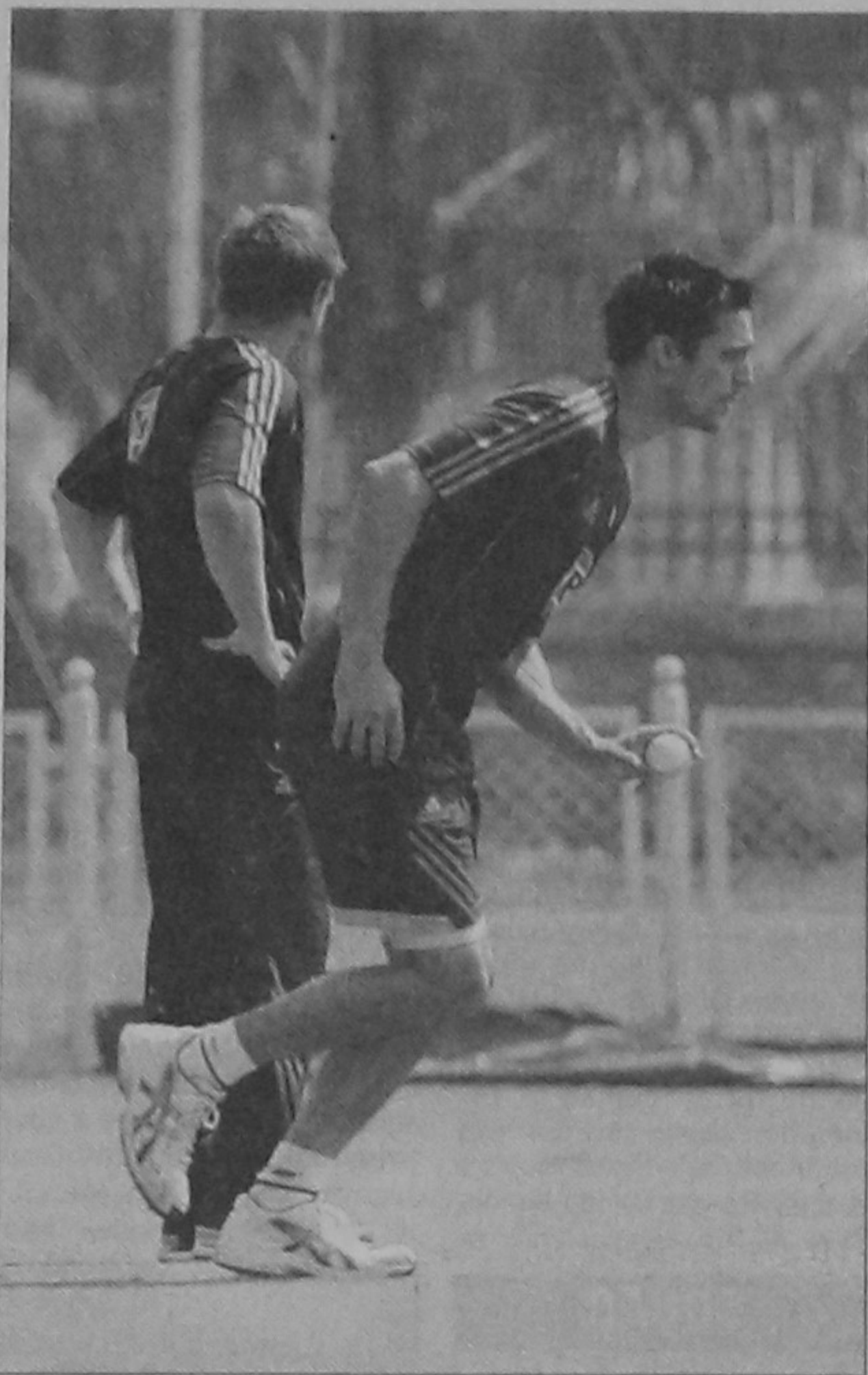

China's women serious about Asiad cricket

China's cricket chiefs are so keen to make a mark in next year's Asian Games at home in Guangzhou that they have sent the women's team to train in India.  
A 15-member squad is currently learning the nuances of a sport unfamiliar in their country in the northern city of Mohali where they are being hosted by the Punjab Cricket Association (PCA).  
Team coach Mamatha Maben, a former India women's international, said cricket was virtually unknown in China a decade ago and it was not easy to get girls to play the sport.

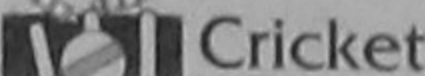

However he has performed well in the latter part of the Bangladesh A team's tour to Maharashtra," said Rafiqul explaining the inclusion of the tall paceman.  
Rafiqul however left room open for incorporating more players into the side for the final two matches of the ODI series.

"The cooling-off period is still in place for the ICL players, as per the board's directive. Therefore none of the players were available for selection," explained Rafiqul.

Wicket-keeper Mushfiqur Rahim comes in as vice-captain in a squad that features eight specialist batsmen, two spinners and four pacers.

Axe falls on Misbah

Butt, Farhat back for Pakistan

Pakistan on Thursday recalled regular openers Salman Butt and Imran Farhat in their squads for next month's limited-over series and Tests against New Zealand.  
Pakistan will play three one-day internationals (November 3, 6 and 9) in Abu Dhabi and two Twenty20 internationals (November 12 and 13) in Dubai in a series which was relocated to neutral territory due to security fears at home.  
Pakistan will later fly to New Zealand to play three Tests, with their home series also relocated over security fears.  
"We have important series against New Zealand and, after thorough work, we have announced three squads for one-dayers, T20s and Tests, in which we have relied on regular openers," chief of selectors Iqbal Qasim told reporters.  
Middle-order batsman Misbahul Haq, a regular member of the team, however failed to find a place in any of the three squads.  
Younus Khan will lead the squad in one-day matches and Tests after he withdrew his resignation, submitted over match-fixing allegations.  
The allegations were levelled over the team's defeats against Australia and New

Zealand in the Champions Trophy earlier this month.  
Shahid Afridi will lead the team in the two Twenty20 matches.  
Pakistan have failed to find a regular set of openers as no pair has settled at international level. Butt, dropped for the Champions Trophy, was recalled for one-dayers and Tests after scoring a century in a domestic competition.  
Farhat, who snapped his ties with the rebel Indian Cricket League, this month staged a comeback after two years. The 27-year-old left-hander is in all three squads.  
Opener Khalid Latif also stages a comeback for the limited over series, while Imran Nazir found a place in the Twenty20 squad only.  
The selectors were forced to leave out Mohammad Asif after Dubai authorities confirmed the controversial paceman cannot travel to the UAE following his deportation on charges of possessing a banned drug last year.  
Asif was detained at Dubai airport for 19 days while returning from India after featuring in the Indian Premier League (IPL) in 2008.  
The 26-year-old was last month brought back into the squad for the Champions Trophy following the expiry of a one-year ban imposed over a failed dope test in the inaugural season of the IPL last year.  
He was however selected for the Tests

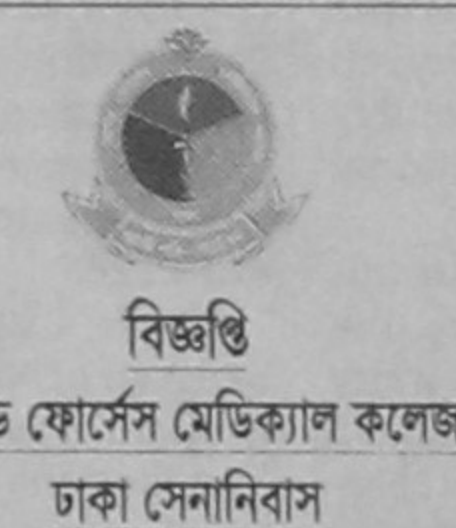
in New Zealand.  
"We were forced to leave out Asif because of some official problems, but hope that he keeps fitness and performs well in the Tests," said Qasim.  
Also staging a comeback for the UAE leg is all-rounder Abdul Razzaq, after he was left out of the Champions Trophy squad.

In financial terms, the difference between exiting the tournament in the semifinal (500,000 dollars) and winning it (2.5 million dollars) was huge. It's probably fair to say that there's never been a domestic match with so much riding on the outcome. Sadly, the occasion seemed to get to Victoria who were never in the game after a tidy first over from Shane Harwood.  
David Warner and Phillip Hughes are quite an opening combination, one determined to bust the myth that left-handers make more elegant batsmen. If Hughes' bat comes down like an axe, the Warner method is redolent of the blacksmith on his anvil. Between them though, they took Peter Siddle apart, combining straight-bat flails with tennis-forehand smears. Once such swipe from Hughes, down to the sight screen, was spectacularly ugly. In this format though, aesthetics mean nothing, and by the time the Powerplay was over, New South Wales had 56 on the board.

told him, 'Mate, we can't afford to do that at the moment.' He played his natural game after that."  
Only Harwood and Andrew McDonald, with his slow medium pace pitched short of a length, adjusted to the conditions. Siddle was too full and Jon Holland, the left-arm spinner, was also brutalised. And though the batting lost some fizz in the second half of the innings, 169 was at least 30 more than Victoria could reasonably have expected to chase.  
"They took the game to us," a disappointed Cameron White said. "It's not easy to play like that on a pitch like this. But we were a little too full or a little too short with our bowling."  
While other captains have whined about having to play on these Delhi pitches, Simon Katich has been utterly phlegmatic about it. "It's like the slow pitches we play on in Sydney," he said when asked if he would have preferred to play the semifinal in Hyderabad. "We're quite used to it." He and his side have made the adjustment seamlessly, and Katich's captaincy deserves plaudits, both for giving Nathan Hauritz a share of the new ball this evening, and also for bringing on a

left-right combination against the spinners earlier in the game. New South Wales have been flexible without being gimmicky, and Katich has had an answer for every situation, Kieron Pollard excepted.  
Brett Lee has bowled with impressive control and fiery pace, and the support from Doug Bollinger, Stuart Clark and the innocuous-looking Moises Henriques has been tremendous. And with Hauritz getting prodigious turn to go with his new-found self-belief, no batting side has really looked at ease against them. Pollard's heroics in Hyderabad merely obscured the fact that Trinidad and Tobago were comfortably second-best for 35 overs of that match.  
Add in the likes of Rohrer, who produced another cameo tonight, and the promise of Steven Smith, and it's not hard to see why Katich's side will be huge favourites on Friday night, no matter who they play. They may be a long way from home, but Australia's most successful state side seem intent on proving that, like the national team, they're a class apart.
