20 hurt, medical college closed

Chittagong Medical College was closed indefinitely yesterday after a clash between Bangladesh Chhatra League and Islami Chhatra Shibir left at least 20 injured.

The college authorities at an emergency meeting in the afternoon took the decision and asked the male students to evacuate two hostels by 8:00pm last night. The female students by 8:00am today.

Earlier, the medical college turned into a evacuate the hostels. battle field following the clash between ruling Awami League-backed BCL and Jamaat-e-Islami-backed Shibir over establishing supremacy on the campus.

Both the BCL and Shibir activists vandalised several rooms of their opposition camp. They also ransacked and set fire to over 20 rooms of Main Hostel of the college and vandalised at

least 10 shops in Chawkbazar. Police charged batons on both the groups

and fired tear gas shells to quell the situation. Sources say the clash ensued in the morning when both the organisations brought out precessions on the campus to welcome the tions leaving 15 students injured. freshers.

The BCL men brought out a procession and held a rally welcoming the freshers at around

11:30am at Mozammel Chattar. The Shibir men also brought out a procession with a number of outsiders prompting the BCL men to chase them. But police intervened

Witnesses say a huge number of Shibir activists from nearby Abdus Sabur Hostel of Chittagong College joined the attack on the BCL activists inside the hostel.

Pak troops capture key militant town

US drone strike kills 14

Activists of Chhatra League and Chhatra Shibir torch nearly 20 residential rooms at Chittagong

Medical College yesterday following a clash between the two students' organisations.

Pakistan said yesterday it had captured Taliban chief Hakimullah Mehsud's hometown as the US demonstrated its support for the war on the Islamists with an air strike that killed 14 people.

"Security forces took control of Kotkai overnight and a clearance operation is in progress," a security official told AFP on condition of anonymity at the start of the second week of a major anti-Taliban offensive.

"It is a major breakthrough because it was the stronghold of Taliban and hometown of Hakimullah Mehsud and Qari Hussain," he added, also referring to a reputed trainer of suicide bombers.

Another security official said ground forces

had surrounded the Kotkai village for the past three days as jets and helicopter gunships pounded militant positions.

"Security forces entered Kotkai late Friday after they had secured important heights behind it," the official said.

And in another part of the northwest tribal belt, a missile fired by an unmanned US drone spy plane killed at least 14 people including three foreign militants, local officials said. The strike took place on a village 15 kilo-

metres (nine miles) north of Khar, the main town of the restive Bajaur tribal district.

"Fourteen people are now known to have been killed in the drone attack and the toll is likely to rise," a tribal administration official told AFP.

UN inspectors will enter Iran's days after Tehran postponed its response to a UN deal on supplying the Islamic republic with nuclear fuel.

Media said the team will spend three days in the country as it inspects the facility being built inside a mountain near the holy city of Qom, south of the capital.

Tehran's disclosure of the new plant to the IAEA on September 21 triggered widespread global outrage, with US President Barack Obama warning Iran would face "increased pressure" if it does not come clean on its nuclear activities.

Eight more bodies were recovered from the Padma in Faridpur yesterday after a boat capsized on Friday. The death toll stands at 14. The victims were identified as Kalu Pramanik, 25, Atiqul, 25,

Forhad, 25, Ujjal, 23, Altaf, 22, Azad, 30, Bipul, 21, and Jamal, 25, of Char Nabin, Nabin and Chaikula villages of Chatmohor upazila in Pabna. Two passengers were still missing, some of the survivors said.

Earlier on Friday, divers of Fire Service and Civil Defence recovered six bodies after the motorboat capsized in the Padma near Shoitankhali of Sadarpur upazila. Many of the passengers managed to swim ashore while oth-

ers went missing. The sand-laden boat was headed to Narayanganj from Akoter Char with 40 labourers and collided head-on with a trawler from the opposite direction around 6:00am due to dense fog.
