## MCCI award for investigative journalism on environment

# Govt to fix price limit for food grains

## Says minister

The government will fix a price limit for food grains in the food procurement policy to make sure that farmers get due profits and produce adequate crops to cut dependency on food import, Food and Disaster Management Minister Abdur Razzaque said yesterday.

"We must help farmers keep their interest to grow more food grains. For this, we shall fix the highest and lowest price. If anyone crosses the limit, the government will make market intervention," he said.

Razzaque said this while presiding over a discussion at the ministry on domestic food procurement policy, procedures, problems and prospects.

Food Secretary Mokhesur Rahman, Bangladesh Agriculture University Vice Chancellor Dr Abdus Sattar Mondal, Brac Executive Director Dr Mahabub Hossain, Centre for Policy Dialogue Head of Research Dr Uttam Deb, Bangladesh Institute of Development Studies Research Director Dr Asaduzzaman, Directorate General of Food Plus Costa, farmers and rice millers were present.

"The food procurement policy will be amended before the next food procurement drive. In no way, there should be dependence on food import. Therefore, an improved management will be designed so farmers, consumers and traders all benefit," the minister said.

The minister, who is an agriculturist by

profession, said the farmers might be provided with more subsidies on agricultural inputs to encourage them to grow food crops. Besides, the government may also buy more food to increase prices to help them get just price, he noted.

This year, rice procurement price was more than the market price, but the farmers could not get the expected price, he said, adding that therefore new policy should be formulated.

The food minister said godowns could be set up at private level in the rural areas from where the government can procure rice at a fixed price or traders may buy certain amount of food from farmers at government-fixed price and then supply to the government.

## Body to probe CMC clash: 3 Shibir men held

Police arrested three Islami Chhatra Shibir men yesterday following Saturday's clash between members of Shibir and Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) at Chittagong Medical College (CMC) while a five-member committee was formed to probe into the matter.

The arrestees -- two CMC students and an outsider -- Rusho and Rajiv Md Walullah, a fifth year and a third year student respectively, and Mashrur Hossain, a fourth year student of Accounting department of Haji Md Mohsin College were kept at the Panchlaish police custody.

Besides, a tense situation is prevailing at CMC as BCL activists rushed to the main hostel after being informed that a group of 10-12 Shibir

men attempted to capture few rooms yesterday carrying sticks and locks.

Assistant Commissioner of Panchlaish Police Station SM Nurul Huda denied the incident saying the Shibir men failed to enter the hostel when additional force chased them.

CMC Principal Prof Dr Gofranul Hoque said the committee, led by Vice Principal Prof Dr Amin Uddin A Khan and consists of Prof Anwar Hossain, Prof Mohibullah, Dr Jilur Rahman and Dr Saroj Kumar Majumder, was asked to submit its report within fifteen days.

All the academic activities, including MBBS and BDS course examinations, regular classes and ward duties, were suspended for indefinite period, said the sources.

However, the admission process for the first year MBBS

course is going on amid tight security after two platoons of police were deployed there.

Earlier, three male hostels of CMC were evacuated after the authorities, in an emergency meeting on Saturday, declared the college shut for indefinite period following the clash that left at least 20 students, including a policeman, injured.

Only the foreign students were allowed to stay at particular blocks of the hostels.

Meanwhile, Additional Superintendent of Police (Hathazari circle) Babul Akhter said eight platoons of police in assistance with the Chittagong University authorities raided Shah Amanat Hall and Suhrawardy Hall yesterday on information that outsiders were gathering there, known as dens of Shibir activists.

However, police found none there.

## Eviction drive after river survey by Nov

Shipping Minister Shahjahan Khan yesterday said survey of the rivers are going on as per the High Court order and after the completion of the task by November drive would be conducted to dismantle illegal installations and evict grabbers.

He said dredging would be done to expand river routes and four firms have been given the work of dredging rivers.

He said these at a discussion while visiting Ananda Shipyard and Shipways Ltd at Sonargaon Meghnaghat in Narayanganj yesterday.

The shipping minister said like garment sector the shipyard-building sector has huge potentials. He said shipyard would play an important role in invigorating the economy of the country.

Delegation of OAV-German Asia Pacific Business Association visited Ananda Shipyard and

participated at a discussion on "Ship building industry in Bangladesh" on the Shipyard premises.

Chairman of Ananda Shipyard and Shipways Ltd naval architect Dr Abdullah Bari presided over the programme. Executive director of the firm Afroza Bari, German Ambassador Holger Michael, head of German delegation Pete Kalson and Director of the Export Promotion Bureau (EPB) AKM Monzurul Haq were present.

BSS adds: Shahjahan Khan said the government is contemplating formulation of a policy for the promising shipbuilding industry in view of its economic prospect, as the sector is becoming a thrust one in the country.

Terming Bangladesh's shipbuilding industry as a promising sector, Holger Michael said the German government is ready to provide Bangladesh with all-out technical support to boost the sector.

## One shot by extortionists

Criminals yesterday afternoon shot an employee of an underconstruction building and stabbed a construction labourer in the city's East Kazipara area under Kafrul Police Station as the owner refused to pay toll.

A gang of three criminals shot Belal Uddin Pradhan, 35, caretaker of the building, on his thigh and chopped Alamgir Hossain, 25, a construction labourer, in different parts of his body with a machete at around 4:30pm.

The injured were rushed to Dhaka Medical College and Hospital.

Abdul Awal, owner of the building, told The Daily Star that four months ago one Ripon demanded toll from him over phone as he was constructing the building. When he refused to pay the toll, three to four days later they shot a security guard of his building.

## CU teacher dismissed for unsocial activity

Chittagong University (CU) syndicate yesterday dismissed a lecturer of international relations department from service for his involvement in unsocial activity.

Foyez Ahmed was dismissed at a regular meeting of the syndicate with Vice Chancellor Prof Dr Abu Yusuf in the chair.

Syndicate member Prof Kamrul Huda told The Daily Star that the meeting decided to terminate the service of Foyez since the university authorities had certified copy of the court order that awarded financial punishment to the teacher for his involvement in unsocial activity.

"According to the service rules of the university none can continue job if he faces any conviction," said Prof Kamrul.

Earlier, Foyez was also issued a show-cause notice, but he didn't reply on time that pushed his answer beyond the consideration of the syndicate, he added.

Mentionable, Detective Branch (DB) police of Chittagong Metropolitan Police arrested Foyez with five girls from the ninth floor of an apartment at the city's Chattershwary intersection on August 20.

He was released on the following day when police produced him and made prosecution submission before a court under section 76 of Metro Ordinance.

## Hizb ut-Tahrir student body active at DU

Chhatra Mukti, the student body of banned Islamist political party Hizb ut-Tahrir Bangladesh, has recruited secretly a good number of Dhaka University (DU) students as its members in the last couple of years, and started its activities on the campus by giving programmes on different issues.

Chief Coordinator of Hizb ut-Tahrir Mohiuddin Ahmed declined to mention the exact number of Chhatra Mukti activists at DU considering the present crisis period of the organisation.

The government on Thursday banned all activities of Hizb ut-Tahrir on charge of carrying out anti-state, anti-government, anti-people and anti-democratic activities for long in the country.

Talking to The Daily Star, Mohiuddin, also an assistant professor of the Institute of Business Administration (IBA) at DU, said, "We are observing the situation and would disclose later about the student body."

He said Chhatra Mukti started its organisational activities in 2005 and it has many members.

Mahfuzur Rahman, a DU student, is the convener of the student body, said Mohiuddin while talking to The Daily Star over phone recently.

He said students are the main force of the organisation and Chhatra Mukti has become successful in establishing its network in most of the public universities in the country as well as private universities and colleges in the city.

Members of Chhatra Mukti held demonstrations on DU campus in last couple of years on different issues including

cancellation of quota system in government services and punishment to a DU teacher.

The student body used both organisational and the banner of general students to hold such programmes which were participated by several hundred students in most of the times.

The organisation also distributed subversive leaflets among the students on different occasions.

On February 26, 2007 police arrested four Chhatra Mukti activists on DU campus on charge of distributing leaflets among the students protesting the presence of Nobel Laureate Prof Muhammad Yunus as convocation speaker at DU.

On May 10, 2008 Chhatra Mukti members under the banner of 'General Students' staged demonstration on DU campus for several days against a DU teacher accusing him of sexually harassing a female student.

Many of Chhatra Mukti leaders and activists, who are female students, also met the then DU vice chancellor on the same issue.

On February 7, 2008 several left-leaning student organisations got united and clashed with members of Chhatra Mukti when they were circulating leaflets demanding reforms in quota system.

The left-leaning student bodies met the then DU vice chancellor and demanded ban on the activities of Chhatra Mukti on the campus.

At a press conference in September 2008, the left-leaning student bodies alleged that Chhatra Mukti is recruiting DU students by offering money and providing other facilities.

Chhatra Mukti Convener Mahfuzur Rahman told this

correspondent last year that their organisational activities are run from its central office located at a market near Katabonin the city.

Officer-in-Charge of Shahbagh Police Station Rezaul Karim told The Daily Star that Chhatra Mukti members distributed subversive leaflets among the DU students at different times.

He also said a case was filed against several Chhatra Mukti activists in connection with the distribution of subversive leaflets.

DU Proctor Dr KM Saiful Islam said, "There is no room for any reactionary student body at Dhaka University and Chhatra Mukti will be listed as reactionary organisation."

He said the Paribesh Parishad, a body formed by the representatives of students and authorities, will take final decision in this regard.
