# 300 Bangladeshis stuck in visa glitch

### Face no-job or arrest in KSA as Saudi authorities deny any error

At least 300 Bangladeshi workers staying in Saudi Arabia on "duplicate visas" are now stuck between a rock and a hard place as they have either to work illegally or get arrested and then deported any-

Bangladesh mission in Riyadh said Saudi embassy in Dhaka had an error in the computerised visa issuing process and some recruiting agencies took the advantage of it and had work visas stamped by the Saudi embassy for the second time to send workers to the Kingdom.


