

Andrew Flintofff wants to win more silverware with Lancashire after agreeing a new three-year contract with his native county.

England all-rounder Flintoff, who is recovering from knee surgery, retired from Test cricket after helping his country regain the Ashes from Australia in August, saying his body could no longer stand the strain.

But the 31-year-old is continuing as a limitedovers cricketer and wants to represent England at the 2011 World Cup in India, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh.

Flintoff, who made his Lancashire debut in 1995, is equally keen to add to the two trophies he has alreadywon with the Old Trafford-based county. "To sign a new deal is what I wanted to do," he said Friday. "I've played for the club since I was

nine and I don't want to play anywhere else in


