
Bol chief upbeat on FDI flow

The state-run investment promotional body chief is upbeat on foreign direct investment flow to Bangladesh at an amount of at least \$5 billion a year, despite the present declining trend.

i"It is our target to receive a minimum of \$ 3 billion and a maximum of \$5 billion in oversees investment per year," SA Samad told a meeting of foreign entrepreneurs in Dhaka yesterday.

Held at Radisson Water Garden Hotel, the monthly luncheon was organised by Foreign Investors' Chamber of Commerce and Industry (Ficci).

The Board of Investment (BoI) executive chairman also drew the entrepreneurs' attention to Bangladesh's improving investment climate.

Pointing his finger at the present recovery from global recession by major economies, Samad hoped that the country would come out of the 2009 FDI trend.

The 2008 FDI was \$1 billion.

"We expect foreign investors to shift some of their investments to Bangladesh, considering the lesser impacts of global recession in the country," the BoI chief said.

Referring to Ficci President Waliur Rahman Bhuiyan who suggested a doubledigit growth for the alleviation of poverty, Samad said, "It is not easy. But we can be optimistic to achieve that if private sector investment gains momentum."

He assured investors of government policy support.

Samad admitted to some hurdles in new investment, such as utilities. "A democratic government is more investment-friendly. We have to be more pragmatic."

FDI is expected to grow steadily from low base but could pick up significantly if energy situation improves, said the Ficci president.


"Foreign investors have demonstrated widespread interest in Bangladesh after the new democratic government took over, Bhuiyan said.

Bangladesh's FDI registration in the January-July period stood at \$ 573.60 mil-

Although the country's investment climate compares favourably with most other South Asian countries, particularly in terms of competitive labour costs and flexible labour laws, the cost of doing business in Bangladesh is perceived to be high, said Bhuiyan.

"The high cost is a reflection of corruption, a weak law and order situation, inadequate infrastructure and services, gaps in the skills base and distressed financial markets," the Ficci president said.

"If the existing foreign investors are happy, then only will prospective investors be encouraged to invest. We feel BoI can play a significant role in this regard."

Former minister stresses market watchdog

An independent watchdog is required to control soaring essential commodity prices and ensure moderate living standards, said former commerce minister Amir Khosru Mahmud Chowdhury yesterday.

Chowdhury also suggested engaging economic experts in place of civil servants in foreign embassies to help expand and promote business abroad.

Chowdhury, Chittagong City BNP convener, was speaking at a meeting at his Mehedibagh home in Chittagong.

He said a reactivation of the Trading Corporation of Bangladesh (TCB) to check monopoly and control the market was not possible, as spot buying guided the international market.

procurement by bidding hardly draws the interest of exporters abroad, he added.

Building buffer stocks and releasing essential commodities in times of crisis can check retail and wholesale markets, Chowdhury said. "That was not possible as essential commodities are mostly perishable and TCB deals only with four such Chowdhury stressed the

TigerIT ranks first in US competition

TigerIT Bangladesh Ltd, a local IT firm, ranked first in minutiae interoperability exchange test by US-based National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST).

The purpose of the Minutiae Interoperability Exchange Test (MINEX) is to determine the feasibility of using minutiae data as an interchange medium for fingerprint information between different fingerprint matching systems. This is recognition for

Bangladesh for developing identity (ID) management, which may help local IT companies to get works from the global market, said Ziaur Rahman, chairman and chief executive officer of TigerIT Bangladesh.

"This recognition means we are the best in some sectors, such as making national ID cards and machine readable passports," he said.

MINEX is designed to evaluate whether various populations and combinations of encoding schemes, probe templates, gallery templates and fingerprint matchers will produce suc-

cessful matches. The recently published NIST test results revealed that a combination of the Tiger's AFIS (automated fingerprint identification system) enrolment template generator and the matcher showed false non-match rate of 0.06 percent at a fixed false match rate of 0.01 for two fingers.

It outperformed Japanese NEC's 0.08 percent, USbased Cogent's 0.11 percent and France's Sagem 0.12 percent.

TigerIT was earlier ranked second by NIST for developing an automated fingerprint identification system with high accuracy.


A 4-day housing fair, Abashon Mela-2009, will begin in the city from Wednesday.
