The government is going to fill a vacant post of national professor soon.


The decision was made at a meeting of the high-powered National Professor Selection Committee at secretariat with Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid in the chair.

Today is the fourth death anniversary of Enayetullah Khan, founding editor of The New Age and editor-in-chief of the weekly Holiday, says a press release.

A titan of Bangladeshi journalism of regional and international repute for his fearlessness for more than four decades, Enayetullah Khan passed away in Toronto, Canada, at the age of 66. He had been suffering from cancer of the pancreas.

Having begun his career as a journalist as a cub reporter for the then Pakistan Observer in 1959, Enayetullah Khan went on to found the weekly Holiday in August 1965, before taking over as editor of the paper in 1966.

He was also the editor of the Bangladesh Times between 1975 and 1977. He was awarded the Ekushey Padak for excellence in journalism.

He also served as a minister and as an ambassador to China, North Korea, Cambodia and Myanmar.

Enayetullah Khan was also the president of the National Press Club and the Dhaka Club.



Take joint action to tackle climate change, recession

Zillur urges OIC countries

President Zillur Rahman yesterday urged the leaders of Muslim Ummah to take a concerted action to face the two-pronged problem of adverse effects of the global climate change and economic recession that has hit the OIC member-countries like

Mentioning that Bangladesh is one of the worst victims of climate change, although its contribution to this global menace is insignificant, Zillur said the country's development efforts have been severely frustrated by the devastating impacts of natural disasters.

"Climate change-induced disasters are now hurting us with increased frequency and severity. They are threatening our development gains over the last few decades, and also our efforts to attain the Millennium Development Goals. The erratic pattern of floods, cyclones and droughts is posing particular threat to our food security," he told the meet.

Two polytech students killed as study tour bus overturns

Two students of Rajshahi Polytechnic Institute were killed early yesterday when a bus carrying a group of students on a study tour overturned while trying to speed away from armed robbers.

The dead were identified as Raju Ahmed and Irene Parvin Molly, both 5th semester students of the institute, while 30 others, including two teachers, were also injured in the accident at Dhamuirhat in Naogaon.

The accident took place at around 2:30am when armed robbers signalled the driver to stop, but he tried to speed away as the robbers chased the bus with firearms.

The students were going to Phulbari coalmine in Dinajpur on a study tour.

Fifteen of the injured, including RPI Vice Principal Moazzem Hossain and parttime teacher Masum Reza, were taken to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital while the other injured were given first aid.

Ensure safety of ship-breaking workers

HC asks govt

The High Court yesterday directed the government to take proper steps to enforce the rules of Labour Law 2006 in the ship-breaking industries in Sitakunda to ensure safety of the workers.

The court also issued a rule upon the government to explain why it should not be declared that the incidents of deaths of some workers in the shipbreaking industries resulted from the failure of the government to discharge its duties in enforcing the labour law.

In the rule, the court also asked the government to explain why it should not be directed to ensure the safety of labourers through properly. enforcing the labour law.

A High Court bench of Justice Syed Mahmud Hossain and Justice Quamrul Islam Siddiqui gave the order following a writ petition filed by Ain O Salish Kendra (ASK), a human rights organisation.

The petition stated that about 30,000 workers have been working in a very vulnerable situation in the ship-breaking industries due to the government's failure to enforce the rules of the labour law.

On an average, a worker dies a week and a worker fall sick a day due to poisonous gases and other accidents, it said.

The petition also said that the government earns Tk 900 crore every year and 90 percent of the demand for iron is met from this sector, but the future of this sector is bleak due to non-enforcement of

Secretaries to the industries and labour and employment ministries, inspector general of factories, Chittagong divisional commissioner and the president of Ship-Breakers Association have been asked to reply to the rule.
