
SC delivers Bangabandhu verdict at 11:00am today as nation waits to see culprits behind the horrendous crime get punished

The nation waits to hear the ultimate verdict today in the Bangabandhu murder case trial with bated breath and also in the expectation that finally justice will prevail. It has been a long, painful journey for the people of Bangladesh. It ought not to have been this way, for the particular reason that the liberation of Bangladesh from Pakistani occupation in December 1971 was considered symbolic of a clean break with the past. That Bangalees would see democracy grow in their country, that under the leadership of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman they would go forth to create Shonar Bangla, a cause the Father of the Nation had consistently espoused since he emerged with his Six-Point programme of regional autonomy in the mid-1960s, was not a misplaced expectation. Indeed, it was a dream that seemed eminently attainable with Bangabandhu as the undisputed leader of this country.

And yet that dream was to be marred by the conspiracies already afoot to undermine Bangabandhu and his government. These conspiracies took form and substance even as the government struggled to provide meaningful leadership to the nation. In the pre-dawn hours of 15 August 1975, the conspirators struck. As the nation slept, the killer squads fanned out across various key points in Dhaka, the pre-eminent one being the residence of the President of the Republic, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. In one fell stroke, the assassins put an end to the life of the Father of the Nation and to the lives of most members of his family.

COMPENSATION NEGOTIATION FOR CLIMATE FALLOUT

Bangladesh will lose 8 percent of its rice and 32 percent of wheat production by 2050 if the sea level rises by one metre engulfing 20 percent of its land and displacing 20 million people.

Fahmida Khatun, additional director of research of the Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD), said this yesterday citing an Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) report published in 2007.

State Minister for Environment and Forest Hasan Mahmud said Bangladesh would demand a deal in Copenhagen that would ensure compensation measuring its vulnerability and number of people exposed to the impact of climate change.

"If we negotiate over the vulnerability due to climate change and people exposed to the risk, we will be the most benefited," he said while speaking as the chief guest of the dialogue on "Copenhagen Conference on Climate Change Advancing Bangladesh's Interests" organised by CPD.

The state minister said population of many island countries would not be as many as the population of one coastal district in Bangladesh. So we should bargain on the basis of people exposed to the impact of climate change.

Members of Bangladesh negotiation team, climate experts and other development workers working on climate change were present. Osman Farruk, former education minister, was present at the dialogue as special guest.

Revenue rises on money-whitening

Revenue earning from the construction sector increased sharply in the first three months of this fiscal year (FY) as whitening black money was allowed.

But earning from a major sector -- power -- decreased due to a fall in power generation.

This was found by analysing earning from income tax, value added tax (VAT) and import tax in the first three months of the

During July-September period of this FY, VAT collection from construction firms was 28.33 percent higher than that in the corresponding period of FY 2008-09.

In this year's budget, whitening black money was allowed in different forms. The beneficiaries include those who would buy flats in the capital and other cities, and in these cases the NBR would not question the source of the money.

Expressway, metro rail set to be knotty

Transport experts oppose projects to be executed without feasibility study

The billion-dollar projects of elevated expressway and metro rail for the capital city without detailed feasibility study is likely to bring about financial and technical debacles, said country's leading transport experts.

The communications ministry on November 18 embarked on a \$2-billion project with invitation for tender bidding to build a 32.5km elevated expressway on public private partnership (PPP) basis.

Prof Jamilur Reza Chowdhury, a noted civil engineer and transport expert, said the project seems to be the contractor-oriented.

"It is not understandable how the authorities will go for tender for the project without carrying out feasibility study," he said adding, "It will be risky to proceed with such project without conducting detailed feasibility study and defining the project parameters." The government is interested in pursuing

massive projects without exhausting any of the first-phase recommendations made in the twenty-year long Strategic Transport Plan (STP) (2004-2024).

The first-phase recommended projects in the STP include elevated way reviews, regional highway connections, Panthapath to Rampura

highway, Tejgaon airport tunnel, bus route priority measures and mass rapid transit (MRT) preparatory works.

MRT system may be a long-term solution but effective traffic and pedestrian management and recovery of the existing road-width will significantly improve the traffic situation immediately, said Jamilur Reza who headed a 31-member advisory committee on STP.

The cabinet committee on economic affairs on October 20 gave a go-ahead to float open invitations for tenders for construction of a metro rail and an elevated expressway at an estimated cost of Tk 15,000 crore.

The committee also approved exemption from bidding prosedures in Private Infrastructure Committee, Major Terms and Conditions Committee and Bangladesh Private Sector Infrastructure Guidelines on a plea of saving time in selection process.

Nazrul Islam, executive director of Infrastructure Investment Facilitation Centre (IIFC) under Economic Relations Division, who was the team leader of preparing Private Sector Infrastructure Guidelines said, "Such multibillion projects require adequate attention and

Under the authority of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh (GOB), the Bangladesh Bridge Authority (BBA) under the potential international Investor(s) for the Financing and Construction of a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) basis. Total cost of the project will be approximately US\$ 2.00 billion.

Background of the Project:

Dhaka, capital of Bangladesh is the largest and most densely populated city, with 13 million people (6200 person/sq, km.) out of the nation's total population of 140 million. Dhaka is the administrative, commercial and rapidly and expected to double in size over the next 20 years. The specifically include: transport sector in Dhaka City is composed of many different modes - Background & Registration of the Firm(s) both motorized and non-motorized. These various modes of transports often use the same road space resulting in a high level of operational disorder. Dhaka has yet to develop an integrated Mass Transit System. Objective and Scope:

The Dhaka Elevated Expressway will improve road connectivity between the northern part of Dhaka City with the central, south and south eastern part linking important commercial and business centers of the city. In addition to providing a much-needed increase in traffic capacity, the Expressway will be designed to relieve existing overloaded roads. Access and distribution to the Expressway will be designed to avoid adding congestion to existing facilities. Transit and high-occupancy use of the Expressway will be encouraged. Existing roads occupy only 8% of land area of city as against an ideal proportion of 25%.

The Project Investor(s) will be selected through an international competitive bidding process from a pool of applicants who meet the criteria set forth in the Pre-qualification document. The selected Project Investor will be required to arrange the necessary financing and execute the key project documents for the project.

BBA seeks to pre-qualify interested Investor(s) and prepare a short list of pre-qualified firms and with the intention to invite eligible international firms to indicate their interests for participation in the work. The Applicant(s) should have essential experience and requisite qualifications in the financing and construction of expressways, toll roads and bridges on a BOOT /BOT/PPP basis with combined value of not less than US\$500 Million over the last 12 years. 
