Titas to introduce prepaid gas meters for Dhanmondi

Titas Gas Transmission and Distribution Company Ltd will introduce prepaid gas meters for its residential consumers in the city's Dhanmondi area.

Initially, Titas plans to install 5,000 prepaid meters in Dhanmondi area under a pilot project within next two years.

On its success, other areas will be brought under the prepaid metering

system. Like DESCO electricity consumers, gas consumers can buy prepaid rechargeable cards from Titas vendor points accord-

For introducing prepaid gas meters, Titas Gas Company yesterday signed an agreement with the Institute of Information and Communication Technology (IICT) of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET).

Titas Company Secretary Abul Bashar and BUET Professor AMM Towfigul Anwar signed the agreement at the Titas head office.

Energy Secretary Mohammad Mohsin, BUET Vice Chancellor Dr AMM

Shafiullah, Petrobangla Chairman Prof Hossain Mansur, Titas Managing Director Md Abdul Aziz Khan and IICT Director Prof Lutful Kabir were also present.

As per agreement, the IICT of BUET will manufacture and supply the prepaid gas meters for Titas Gas to its Dhanmondi residential consumers at a cost of about Tk 4.5 crore in next two fiscal years.

Each meter will cost Tk 5,800. Earlier, the IICT of BUET introduced prepaid electricity meters for DESCO

power consumers in Uttara. Titas Managing Director M Abdul Aziz Khan said that such prepaid metering will bring an end to gas consumers' bill-pay

hazards. "Consumers won't need to wait in queue for hours at banks when the pre-

paid meters are installed." He also said the new meters will check misuse of gas by the consumers when a

crisis is prevailing in gas supply.

Mohsin suggested the Titas Gas management should have interaction with its consumers about prepaid meters so that they can have a positive idea about the new system.

BHP chief 'cautious' on global recovery

The head of the world's largest miner said he was cautious over the strength of the global recovery, as restocking slowed in China and demand in developed nations remained sluggish.

BHP Billiton chief executive Marius Kloppers said strong commodity exports had underpinned a world-beating performance by Australia's economy during the worst global downturn since the Great Depression.

But he warned the bounceback had been slower than expected in advanced nations and the transformation of China's economy would be a complex and unprecedented process that should not be taken for granted.

"We've seen that the economic rationale for continued growth is compelling, but there are other forces at work in this global economy," Kloppers said in an address late Wednesday.

"There's still a lot of hardship out there and I think that on balance we've seen the world come out of this recession a little bit more slowly than we've seen in other events," he added.

Dhaka int'l trade fair in January

The 15th Dhaka International Trade Fair will begin in the city on January 1 with the participation of 10 foreign countries.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is expected to open the month-long fair.

Most of the preparatory works completed to hold the fair successfully, according to the Export Promotion Bureau (EPB).

DITF Member Secretary Sayed Bealal Hossain told the news agency that they have already received approval from the Housing and Public Works Department to use the ground for the fair, while the Architecture Department made a layout of stalls.

The DITF will have five premier pavilions, four premier mini pavilions, 35 premier stalls, 61 pavilions, 40 mini pavilions and 303 stalls. All of these have already been allotted to the applicants.

Open tender was sought for three categories -- premier pavilion, premier mini pavilion and premier stall -where the highest bidders were awarded. The participating foreign countries are Pakistan,

India, China, Iran, South Korea, Thailand, Hong Kong, Malaysia, USA and Turkey. Some 28 pavilions, mini pavilions and stalls were

allotted for the foreign participants of which Pakistan got 14, India 3, South Korea, Thailand and USA two each, while China, Iran, Hong Kong, Malaysia and Turkey one each.

To supervise and co-ordinate the preparatory works, a steering committee of the DITF was formed headed by the commerce secretary.

Fifteen other sub-committees were also formed.

Pizza Inn comes to Dhaka

US-based global restaurant chain Pizza Inn is all set to introduce operation in Bangladesh to grab a portion of middle and upmarket food lovers.

The first outlet, which has been set up at RAK Tower in Uttara, Dhaka, will open tomorrow.

"We believe a market is here. A trend of having alien food is growing among customers," Nazmul Anwar Jewel, director (operations) of Mohammed Foods and Allied Pvt Ltd, the franchisee of the restaurant chain in Bangladesh, told The Daily Star yesterday.

Pizza Inn has operation in several countries with over 360 outlets.

"The market is growing. We want to open three more outlets by December next year," he said, adding that one of the outlets will be outside Dhaka.

"We want to generate around Tk 3-4 lakh in sales a day from our first outlet," the official said.
