"Vested quarters always bar shifting of the cattle market, whenever attempted," said Mohammad Ali, a local youth.

Nasrin Jahan, headmaster of Shutiakati Government Primary School, said the cattle market has led to suspending closing the school and shifting the centre for public examination of class five to adjoining Shutiakati Pilot Girls High School.

"The upazila education office and the committee concerned may shift the venue of public examination centre, but the District Primary Education Office should be informed of it. It was not done," District Primary Education Officer Parvin Jahan said.

Enayet Hossian, president of Shutiakati Union High School managing committee, and Md Abdus Salam, headmaster of the school, said the administration had been assuring them of shifting the market for long but to no

# Raushan places list of 8,000 'JP activists' for VGF relief

Jatiya Party (JP) lawmaker Raushan Ershad endorsed about 8,000 people of Rangpur Sadar upazila for food relief under Vulnerable Group Feeding (VGF) Programme 'violating' the rules.

The distribution of rice under the programme in the upazila has become uncertain as the union VGF committees could not prepare a list of the beneficiaries following Raushan's interference.

The government under its safety net programme has allocated 10 kgs of rice for each of 2,23,604 vulnerable people in the district ahead of the Eid-ul-Azha.

According to programme, 34,861 people of Rangpur Sadar upazila (Rangpur-3 constituency) are to get VGF

A number of union parishad (UP) chairmen under Sadar upazila on condition of anonymity said they could neither accept nor dishonour her list. Most of the people on the list are activists of Jatiya Party, the chairmen said.

Moqbul Hossain said, "We are in an embarrassing situation because most of constituency about the steps taken by the the people on the list do not deserve VGF relief."

Sadar upazila Nirbahi officer Mostain Billah told this correspondent that he asked each union VGF committee to detect if the people on the list really mean that the committees will have to deserve food relief or not.

Mostafizar Rahman, also the chairman of

the upazila VGF committee, said Raushan Ershad has no right to prepare the list of beneficiaries.

As per rules, the union VFG committee is to prepare a list of the vulnerable people. The list is to be sent to upazila VGF committee for approval. Before approval, Chairman of Rajendra Union Parishad the upazila committee will inform the parliament member of the respective union committees.

When contacted, Raushan Ershad said, "People of my constituency may expect something from me. I sent the list to the union committees. It doesn't bring all on the list under VGF Sader Upazila Parishad Chairman programme. They may exclude those who don't deserve it.
