Asked, Aziz said the NCB Dhaka office has renewed the red alert notices against the fugitive killers and is also continuing conversation with the Interpol office in different countries regarding deportation of the fugitives.

In reply to a question, he said, "A country had sought details of another fugitive convict Lt Col (retd) SHMB Nur Chowdhury, who is now staying in Canada. We have already met their demands collecting information through the CID.'

Apart from Nur and Rashed, the Interpol red notice includes the names of four other convicted killers --Lt Col (retd) Khandaker Abdur Rashid, Lt Col (retd) Shariful Haque Dalim, Capt (retd) Abdul Mazed and Risalder Moslehuddin Khan.

Talking to The Daily Star, Inspector General of Police (IGP) Nur Mohammad said, "The deportation of the fugitive killers of Bangabandhu depends on the move of the government and its diplomatic achievement."

"Interpol can help in the deportation process if the countries concerned reach a consensus", the IGP added.

Earlier on Monday, Law Minister Shafique Ahmed said the Canadian police have seized the passport of Nur Chowdhury since he has been illegally staying in Canada and submitted it to the Bangladesh High Commission in July last year.

enous people -- still remains to

be fulfilled, as Bangalees from the plain who were settled there after 1979 have not been removed from the region yet. The government in 1979 took a policy of sending plain land people to the hills by giving them lands and other facilities there as a neutralising strategy as the conflicts escalated. That subsequently reduced the

indigenous population in the region from 97.5 percent in 1947 to only 51 percent now. The situation deteriorated further as newer cluster villages of settlers were set up since the accord. Even in 2007 during the caretaker government's tenure, over 200 Bangalee families were

freshly resettled in Datkupa of Khagrachhari. The hills people also feel unhappy over the nonactivation of Chittagong Hill Tracts Regional Council and the three Hill District Councils set

up following the agreement. Those councils are supposed to get control over 33 aspects of governance including vital issues like law and order, and land management, which have not been handed over to them. The district administration and police authorities still control those and sometimes ignore the

councils, indigenous leaders alleged. Resettlement of the displaced indigenous people -who had fled homes and either crossed the border or went deeper into the forest as the conflict had begun -- has been one of the thorniest issues since Shanti Bahini, the armed group of the hills people, laid down arms. A land commission was set up to resettle the refugees, but its functioning has failed to please the ethnic communities. The ethnic people tradition-

ally would occupy three kinds of

lands -- lands with proper

ownership records; lands with-

out ownership records; and

ihum lands which also have no

Peace lies in roadmap Much of those lands were later distributed among the settlers from the plain, and the indigenous population wants a proper settlement of the land disputes. However, they resent the decision of the land commission for starting a cadastral survey before settling the disputes, as that would lead to

Even then, the indigenous recording of lands in disputed persons'names. The workings of the land commission have also irked the ethnic people. They feel that the commission should make decisions on any issue on the basis of unanimous consensus. But the commission chairman is empowered to make decisions arbitrarily in case of a lack of that consensus. The Jhummo people feel the Land Dispute Settlement Act should be changed to stop such practice, and the regional council

already recommended an amendment to that end in May. But efforts in that direction are yet to be seen. Moreover, although the indigenous refugees received financial packages for rehabili-

tation, about 9,000 families out of a total 12,000 have not got their lands back. A deep resentment also prevails about the lingering presence of temporary army camps in the hills, which were supposed to be withdrawn after the peace accord. The withdrawal of camps started soon after the accord was signed, but then it halted, and only recently, after Awami League came to

Figures also significantly vary about the total number of camps wrapped up. PCJSS, the political party of the hills people, claims it only knows of a total of 31 camps that have been wrapped up in the last eight years while the government figures put it at 200. Even according to that estimate, 300 other camps still exist. Against such a backdrop,
