Thakurgaon, Kotalipara were freed on this day

Today is December 3. On this day in 1971, valiant freedom fighters hoisted the flag of independent Bangladesh in Thakurgaon town and Kotalipara in Gopalganj by defeating the Pakistan occupation forces.

Following a serious battle with freedom fighters the previous night, Pakistani occupation forces retreated from Thakurgaon town on December 2 and took shelter at Sayedpur Cantonment.

Freedom fighters entered the town on December 3 morning.

As the news spread, people from the adjacent villages came to the town and rejoiced by chanting slogans 'Joy Bangla' with freedom fighters.

Shortly after the Pakistani occupation forces started crackdown in Dhaka on March 26 in 1971, freedom-loving people in Thakurgaon brought out protest processions. Braving to shout 'Joy Bangla' before a non-Bangali Major, rickshaw-puller Mohammad Ali became the first martyr of the Liberation War in Thakurgaon.

During the next several months, the Pakistan forces and their collaborators killed many innocent people including those who were trying to flee to India for safety.

As freedom fighters increased attack on the Pakistani forces from the beginning of November in 1971, the present Panchagarh

district was freed on November 29 and Pakistan occupation forces took shelter at the then Thakurgaon EPR camp.

In the face of joint attack by the freedom fighters and allied forces, Pakistan forces and their collaborators finally fled from Thakurgaon and the entire district was freed on December 3.

To mark the day Thakurgaon Nagarik Committee, Freedom Fighters' association and different organisations have taken different programmes including placing floral wreaths on the martyrs' memorial and discussion meeting, reports our Thakurgaon correspondent.

A correspondent adds from Gopalganj: Hemayet Bahini, who played a glorious role in the struggle for freedom in the region during the liberation war, freed Kotalipara in Gopalganj on December 3, 1971 by defeating about a 500-strong Pakistan army.

"My forces had cornered the Pakistani troops through persistent attacks. In a meeting with 24 sub-commanders on December 2 night, we decided to launch the final attack on occupation forces," recalls Hemayet Uddin Bir Bikram, commander of Hemayet Bahini.

Before the dawn, the freedom fighters led by commander Hemayet started attack from four sides and compelled over 400 Pakistani soldiers to surrender to Hemayet Bahini at 10:00am on December 3.

8 injured as rival AL men clash

At least eight people were injured as two groups of local Awami League clashed at bordering Sadipur village in Benapole yesterday.

Villagers said AL activist Abdul Jalil's son Afil prevented a gang of miscreants led by Kabir, a worker of the party, when the gang was trying to violate a daughter of Abdus Sattar of the same village.

Enraged by it, Kabir and his accomplices attacked the house of Afil and looted valuables from it.

When the news spread in the village, Jalil's supporters swooped on Kabir and his men, leading to a clash between the two groups. Eight people from both sides were injured during the clash that continued for an hour.

Following a case filed by Kabir with Benapole Police Station, police arrested three of the nine accused. Kabir rivals were preparing to file a counter case.

Bridge on the Kumar opens

Labour, Employment and Expatriates Welfare Minister Engineer Khondoker Mosharraf Hossain on Tuesday inaugurated a bridge on river Kumar linking Rothkhola and East Khabashpura area of the town.

The 110 meter long bridge was built by Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) at an estimated cost of Tk 1.50 crore facilitating the movement of a large volume of traffic on the both sides of the thickly populated area.

Addressing the inauguration meeting held at the bridge site, the minister said besides building of road network in this district, the government has paid serious attention to save Faridpur town from the recurring erosion by the river Padma.

An amount of Tk 190 crore has been approved recently for town protection work, he added.

CLASHES OVER DISPUTED LANDS

Two killed in Jamalpur, 50 hurt in N'ganj, Sirajganj

Two people were killed and 10 injured in Jamalpur while 50 others injured in Narayanganj and Sirajganj districts on Tuesday in clashes over disputed lands.

Two people, who sustained serious injuries in a fierce clash between two rival groups at Charpalisha village in Melandah upazila of Jamalpur district on Sunday, died at Mymensingh Medical College Hospital (MMCH) Tuesday, reports UNB.

The victims were identified as Ibrahim and Badar Ali of the village.

Police said there was a longstanding dispute between Abul Hossain and his neighbour Mostaq over the ownership of land property. On Sunday, Mostaq took possession of the disputed land.

The clash ensued when Abul along with his men went to recapture the land on Monday. The clash injured 10 people from both sides.

The injured were rushed to the local hospital. Later, Ibrahim and Badar were shifted to MMCH where they died.

Ibrahim's uncle Amjad Hossain filed a murder case with the police.

Our Correspondent in Narayanganj

reports: At least 15 people were injured in two separate incidents of clashes over disputed lands in Araihaaz of Narayanganj district on Tuesday.

Two of the injured were admitted into Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) in critical condition.

In a clash between two families over a piece of land at Baherchar village under Khakhanda union of the upazila Tuesday night, five people including Ratan, 30, Mosammat Begum, 35 and Mokhtar, 25 were injured. The injured were admitted to upazila health complex.

In a sequel to a long dispute over a cropland between Abdur Rahim and Mofazzal Haque of Dori Bishnondi village under the upazila, a clash erupted when the supporters of Rahim went to capture the land.

Both sides attacked each other with sticks and sharp weapons. At least 10 people including Shamsul Haq, 40, Sohel, 22, Monwar, 45, Abdur Rahim, 48, Peara Begum, 40, Parul, 30 and Mofazzal Haq, 50 were injured.

The injured were admitted to local upazila health complex. Seriously injured Peara Begum and Shamsul Haq were shifted to DMCH.

In Sirajganj, at least 35 people including women and children were injured in a fierce clash between two groups at Dattabarienpara village in Sadar upazila over a piece of land, according to our correspondent.

Police and locals said, a long-standing land dispute was prevailing between Moksed Ali and Hasen Ali of the village.

In a bid to settle the dispute, some local influential headmen arranged a meeting at around 7.30am. But at a stage, the supporters of both groups got agitated and engaged in a fierce clash. Equipped with lethal weapons they attacked each other and hurled brickbats. They also damaged five houses and two shops and took away valuables from the houses and shops.

Of the injured, 18 of the both groups including Moksed Ali's supporters Anower Hossain, Sultan Mahmud, Rabiul Islam, Hasan Ali, Milon, Arif and Mukul and Hasen Ali's supporters Tara Mondol, Hakim Ali, Delsad Ali, Shahadat Hossain, Ismail Hossain, Shah Alam, Shamsul Islam and Abdur Razzaque were admitted to Sirajganj Sadar hospital. The rest were admitted to different local clinics in the town.

Of the total, condition of nine was stated to be critical.
