

Doctor sued for private practice in office hours

The Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court here on Monday issued arrest warrant against a doctor of Dinajpur Medical College and Hospital for doing private practice violating government rules.

Police said Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate AKM Fazlul Haq filed the case on Sunday against Dr Jahanara Begum Munni, assistant professor of Gynaecology and Obstetrics Department of the hospital.

In the case, the complainant stated that his wife Rabeya Shultana went to Dr Munni's private chamber with a complaint of abdominal pain at around 12:30pm on Sunday. After examining Rabeya, Dr Munni charged Tk 300 to her as

fee violating Section 4 of 1974 Act.

The Section 4 of 1974 Act states that government officials will get free treatment from any physician of any state-run hospital. According to the Section 11 of 1974 Act, family members of any government servant will get same medical facilities.

In the case, the complainant also mentioned that the doctor was doing private practice during office hours violating government rules.

Contacted, officer-in-charge (OC) of Dinajpur Kotwali Police Station said they received the arrest warrant issued by the court against Dr Jahanara Begum Munni.

Sources said Dr Munni left Dinajpur for Dhaka on Sunday night.

Paddy seeds seized while being taken to other dist

Authorities seized 1100 kg boro paddy seeds prepared by Bangladesh Agriculture Development Corporation (BADC) while it was being illegally taken from Dimla upazila town to another district on Sunday afternoon.

Informed by local farmers, Dimla Upazila Agriculture Officer Aftab Hossain seized 110 bags of boro seeds, each bag weighing 10 kg, from the local bus stand when those were being loaded on the roof of a Dhaka-bound coach.

One Rabiul Islam was transporting the seed to Madina Beej Bhandar, a seed trading firm in Gobindaganj upazila of Gaibandha district.

The seeds, allotted for the farmers of Dimla

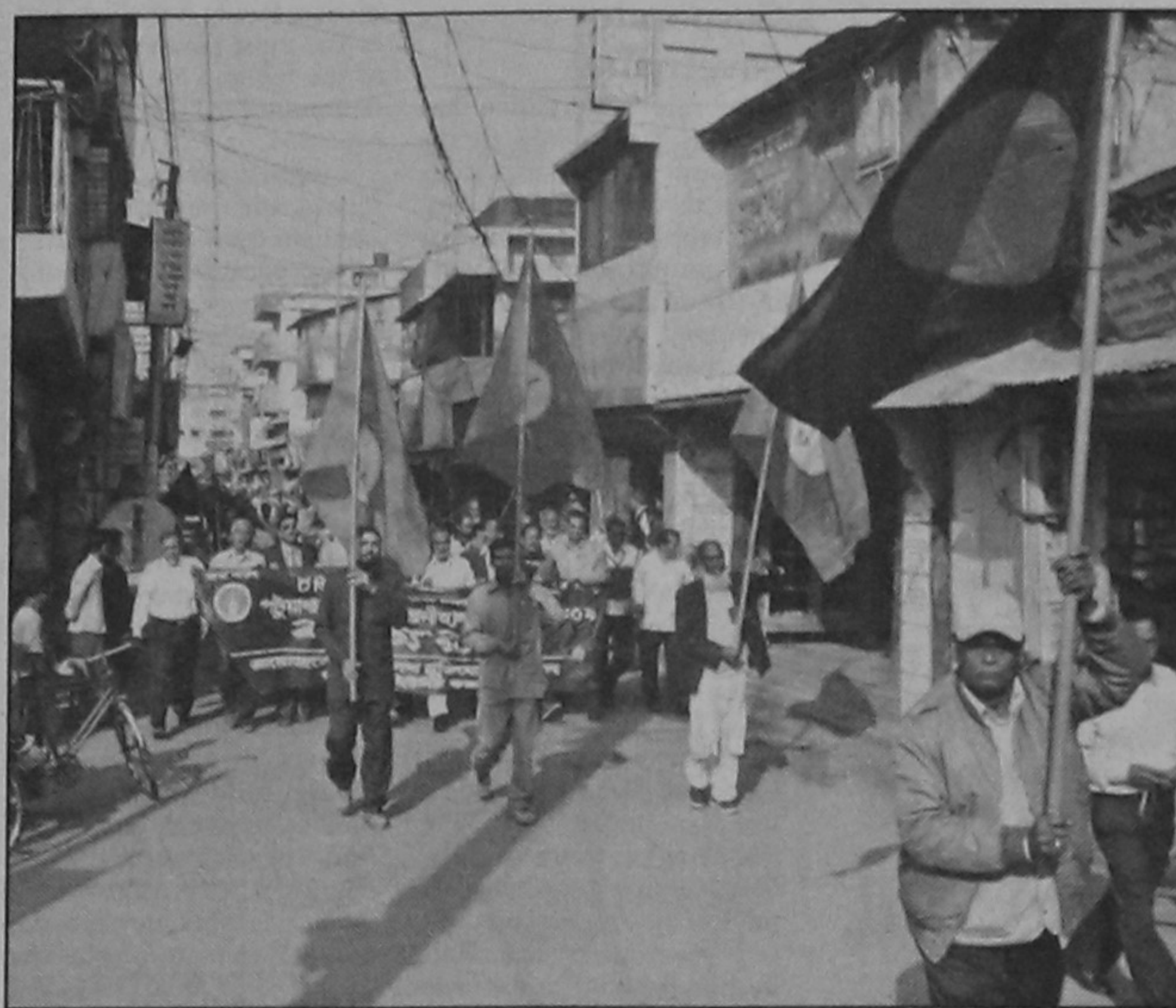
upazila, were illegally sold to people in another district at higher prices, the agriculture officer said.

As per government instructions, boro seeds allotted for Dimla upazila cannot be shifted to any other place, said Dimla Upazila Nirbahi Officer Mizanur Rahman.

Later the seized seeds were taken to the upazila complex premises the same day and sold to 54 farmers at Tk 220 per bag.

The accused seed trader, Rabiul Islam was fined Tk 10 thousand.

"I am not a licence-holder seed trader. I had bought the seeds from Madina Beej Bhandar at Tk 350 per bag of 10 kg. I was returning the seeds to the same destination as the price of seed is very low in Dimla," he said.

Fratricide in Meherpur

An elder brother was killed by his younger during a dispute over ancestral land in a village yesterday afternoon.

Villagers said, Anwarul Haq of village Amjhupi under Sadar upazila was working in their ancestral land.

His elder brother Eshan Ali, 60, came to the place and claimed that it is his portion of the property.

It triggered bitter altercation and at one stage Anwarul hit his elder brother with his spade and fled away.

The labourers on the nearby fields came to his rescue but Eshan died on way to Meherpur hospital.

Passengers suffer as students block road

The students of Gopalganj Government Bangabandhu University College yesterday put up blockade on Dhaka-Khulna highway demanding permission for registration of the 'additional' students of honours first year.

Taking position on Dhaka-Khulna highway in front of Gopalganj Police Lines at around 12:30pm, they chanted different slogans.

As the blockade continued for about one and a half hours, a large number of vehicles got stranded on both sides of the important highway.

Eighty students were admitted in addition to the usual capacity of the college in 2008-09 academic session upon verbal assurance by the dean of National University, Al Hussain Mamun, general secretary of the college students union, said.

But academic life of those students has become uncertain as the university authorities are now dilly-dallying about their registration, he said.

The students union has announced transport strike from morning to 2:00pm and closure of all business firms in the district town today (Wednesday).

Muggers kill press worker

Muggers stabbed a press worker to death on Monday night at Ghope in the town. Victim Biplob Hossain, 28, was the son of Nizamuddin of Newtown area. Police and locals said, after finishing work Biplob, a machine man of Imperial Press left his workplace for home at about 2am. A group of muggers intercepted him in front in Ghope area. They stabbed him severely as he tried to resist them. Hearing his scream, locals rushed to the spot and took him to hospital but the attending doctor declared him dead. A case was filed in this connection. None was arrested till filing of this report yesterday evening.

Criminals attack police

A case was filed on Sunday night against 19 people for attacking police at Soyghati village in Neyamatpur upazila. Officer-in-charge of Neyamatpur police station Shaheed Suhrawardy said a complaint was lodged recently as Sirajul and his terror gang obstructed the cultivation of fish in a pond leased by one Bulu of the same village. The gang intercepted the police team when they, led by ASI Ali Akbar, went to the village to investigate the allegation on Sunday afternoon. At one stage they assaulted Ali Akbar and damaged the police pick-up van, forcing the team to retreat. Bulu later lodged the case against Sirajul and his accomplices.

Youth murdered

Criminals have murdered a youth at Raita village in Bheramara upazila. Police recovered the body of Badsha, 17, son of Ektar Uddin Malitha of the village yesterday. Police said, locals saw the slaughtered body of Badsha on the bank of Padma river at Raita and informed them. They rushed to the spot and recovered it at about 2:30pm. Badsha was a fisherman. Victim's father Ektar told journalists that a local phensid peddler threatened Badsha three days ago as he helped a Rab (Rapid Action Battalion) team to locate the house of another drug trader of the village. According to family sources, Badsha went to Padma river on Sunday noon and since then he was missing.

10 bombs recovered

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) on Saturday night recovered 10 cocktails from a bag kept in front of Comilla EPZ gate and arrested one person in this connection. The arrestee was identified as Saddam Hossain Sajib, 23, of Halaupara village in Sadar Dakkhin upazila. Acting on secret information, a team of Rab-11 raided the area at about 9:30pm and arrested Saddam. Later, the team recovered the bombs kept in a bag. The bombs were defused at the Comilla Rab office ground in presence of Major Shakil, sources said.

25 hurt in Munshiganj clash

At least 25 people were injured when people of two villages at Bhaberchar bus stand area in Gozaria upazila clashed Saturday night. At least 40 shops and other business firms were ransacked during the clash between the people of Pura Baushia and Laxmipura villages. Seriously injured Liton Miah, 23, was admitted to Bhaberchar Health Complex. The clash followed an altercation between people of the two villages over a waj mahfil.

Radha statue recovered

Jhenidah DB police on Saturday night recovered a Radha statue from Gourinathpur village under Kaliganj upazila. Police Superintendent of Jhenidah Rezaul Karim said, a team of DB police raided Gourinathpur village at about 8:30 at night. During the drive police the statue weighing 18 kg from the house of one Shamsul Islam. They arrested Shamsul and Sanoar Hossain for their alleged in the smuggling. Sources said, the statue is made of precious stone and worth Tk 15 crore.

Jubo Dal leader murdered, 25 hurt in AL-BNP clash

A Jessore Jubo Dal leader was hacked to death by rivals on Monday and 25 were injured in Magura as AL, BNP clashed yesterday and the day before while in Pabna BCL, JCD locked in clash on Sunday.

A Jubo Dal leader was hacked to death allegedly by rivals in Sharsa of Jessore on Monday night. Victim Solaiman Hossain, 45, was son of Belayat Hossain and president of Lakkhanpur union Jubo Dal unit, according to a correspondent.

Police and locals said, Solaiman was sitting in his shop at Lakkhanpur Bazar when a gang of 8/10 men all of a sudden appeared there at 8pm and blasted a few bombs to create panic in the area.

Then they hacked Solaiman indiscriminately with lethal weapons leaving him critically injured. Solaiman was rushed to Upazila Health Complex where the duty doctor declared him dead.

A case was filed in this connection with Sharsa police station.

Our correspondent in Magura reports: At least 25 people were injured and eight houses were destroyed during clashes between the supporters of AL and BNP at village Kushabaria yesterday and on Monday night.

Police and locals said, there was a longstanding rivalry between AL organising secretary of Ward No. 3 under Moghi union in Sadar upazila Sadruddin Molla and BNP unit's general secretary Jalaluddin Ahmed of the same locality.

On Monday evening, supporters of Jalaluddin severely beat up 14 people of the rival

group after a row over demarcation of a disputed land, triggering a violent clash yesterday which left at least 11 more people injured.

Both the groups used lethal weapons during yesterday clash that lasted for over two hours from 11:30am.

At one stage, supporters of both sides swooped on the houses of their rivals. Eight houses were destroyed in the attacks and counter-attacks.

The seriously injured 15 were identified as Mahfuzur Rahman, 30, Nazrul, 50, Badsha, 50, Kamrul, 50, Nazmul, 15, Motiar, 45, Rabiul, 30, Nannu, 42, Wahid, 41, Murad, 26, Sagar, 30, Tabibur, 40, Mofizur, 32, and Hafizur, 55. They were admitted to Magura Sadar hospital.

In Pabna, BCL and JCD locked in clashes on Sunday noon in Pabna Edward College over allowing the outsider cadres on the college campus.

During the incident, the BCL activists ransacked four rooms of the college hostel, reports our correspondent.

College sources said, the JCD backed outsider cadres beat up Md. Alam, the driver of college bus on Saturday afternoon. As it mounted tension in the college, the college authorities tried to amicably settle the matter at noon.

When the negotiation meeting was on the outsiders again entered the campus triggering clashes between BCL and JCD activists.

Sources said, during the meeting some BCL activists ransacked two rooms of degree hostels and two rooms of SM hostel and a telephone shop near the college.
