ICL-ers back

BCB announces preliminary squad for tri-series

Four ICL-returnees got the national callup when the selectors picked twenty-six players for the preliminary camp of the India-Bangladesh-Sri Lanka tri-series, which will start from January 4 at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur.

Opener Shahriar Nafees, middle order batsman Aftab Ahmed, all-rounder Alok Kapali and wicketkeeper Dhiman Ghosh, the players who had signed up for the unapproved Indian Cricket League (ICL) in September last year have now been reinstated to the side.

The players had initially received a ten-year ban but got amnesty from the board last June, and have now been included in the long list.

The board at that point also made it clear that the players would not be considered for selection in any international match until December 31 this year but chief selector Rafiqul Alam said that there was a reason to pick up the players before

the completion of the cooling period. "You know, we have a tri-nation series

from the first week of January, so we should take them now if we want to play them in the series. On the other hand we have a busy international schedule for the next six months and that's why we thought that they should get the opportunity to improve their fitness," explained Rafigul adding that these selected player's performance in the ongoing Premier Division Cricket League was not unsatisfactory.

The ICL-bound players had a lot of complaints against this selection panel and blamed them for taking such a risky decision to sign for the unapproved Indian competition.

"For the national interest we can do anything," was the response of chief selector when reminded of the bitter comments against them.

Captain and the country's leading paceman Mashrafe Bin Mortaza has also

Still no answers

The booters after surrendering meekly against India in the semifinal of the Bangabandhu SAFF Championship passed a sleepless night on Friday and tried to discover the reasons behind their poor individual performances, but they hardly got any satisfactory answers.

"There is nothing more to talk about the game and we totally failed against India though we had a plan to press the opponents from the word go, but it boomeranged and pressure got better of us and no player could play his natural game," said Bangladesh captain-cumgoalkeeper Aminul Haque, who, however, had no explanation for the complete failure of the whole team.

Aminul's deputy Wali Faisal was more disappointed with his own show and can't forgive his individual performance.

"Whom will I blame for? I myself could not play well and that is the truth. All the players are mentally shattered after a listless performance, much to the disappointment of a capacity home-crowd," said Wali adding that they had a sleepless night after going down to India.

The Mohammedan defender, however, tried to find out reasons behind Bangladesh's poor

performance against a youthful Indian side.

"Maybe we failed to put on full concentration on the game, thinking that we were going to play the final with a victory over India and such kind of thinking might have hampered our focus, said the leftback, who was hardly seen in his usual overlapping approach in the match.

Wali, however, was in the dark on how all players performed poorly together at the same

"To be honest, one can't always perform, but it is beyond me how all the players failed to perform in a match," said a stunned Wali.

Midfielder Zahed Parvez Chowdhury also had no satisfactory answers. "After the game, we had a discussion

amongst us, but we could not find out any reason why it happened." Like the post-match briefing on Friday

Bangladesh's interim coach Shahidur Rahman Shantoo found no answers on his boys' poor show despite having held a discussion with them. "After returning to the hotel, I talked with the players and the replies were that they could

not play well throughout the game," said Shantoo during their check out from the Pan Pacific Sonargaon hotel last morning. The former Bangladesh goalkeeper, how-

League at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur yesterday.

The match reached a climax when Abahani required nine runs from the last over with the last pair at the crease. Number eleven Shuvasish Roy then cut pacer Shafiul Islam to the fence leaving his team needing to score two runs from the last two balls. They managed a cheeky single to level the score off the penultimate ball to electrify some Abahani supporters at Mirpur. And the pair went for another single off the last ball after Arafat Sunny played an ondrive but only saw Mushfigur Rahim shatter their hopes to gain full points.

Abahani now has a three points gap with leaders Mohammedan.

It was however Shafiul Islam who celebrated his first time national call-up with a scintillating all-round show. The young man smashed an

unbeaten 55 off 50 balls with three fours and four big sixes batting at number ten as Biman put up a decent total of 173 in 42 overs. He then picked up two wickets, that of Imrul Kayes (67) and Rony

Talukdar (1) to become man-of-the-match. Nobody had expected it could be an exciting game after Biman scored 173, but the disciplined bowling from the Biman bowlers and some senseless dismissals of Abahani batsmen made sure of the second tied game in the competition after the Gazi Tank and Partex match in

the first round. Left-handed opener Imrul top scored with 67 but he was the culprit by letting his team down. Imrul unnecessarily went for a big one against Shafiul when all that was needed was for him to carry the innings. He only reached at the safe hands of Sri Lankan Hasanta Fernando at mid on.

Nasir Hossain, the second best scorer with 33 batting at number seven, made the same mistake and this time the bowler was spinner Elias Sunny. Abahani fell in big trouble when Shakib Al Hasan lobbed the ball to Tushar Imran off spinner Sharifullah as they tottered at 38-3.

Manu chef de MSC stretch lead

On a day when defending champions Abahani dropped points playing out a tie against high-flying Biman, leagueleaders Mohammedan extended their lead brushing aside Victoria in a one-sided

match in the Super League stage of the Ispahani Tea Premier Division Cricket League yesterday. Mohammedan's victory at Fatullah came by 8 wickets which puts them firmly in the drivers' seat for claiming the title, three points above nearest chasers Abahani and five clear of Biman.

It was another day of curtailed matches as fog played foul in most parts of the country. Fatullah's match was reduced to 37-over-aside which started at midday. Mohammedan skipper Khaled Masud, on winning the toss, had no qualms about opting to field first to take obvious advantage of seaming conditions in overcast weather. And his bowlers didn't let him down. They bowled tidily to make Victoria batsmen work hard for their runs. Only two Victoria batsmen batted with some authority while the others failed to negotiate with Mohammedan spinners. Kamrul Islam topscored with 33, but his run-out put paid to

their hopes of posting a big score. Mohammedan's veteran all-rounder Foysal Hossain was the wrecker-in-chief taking three important wickets, including the precious one of Victoria skipper Mohammad Sharif who scored a quick-fire 31 to lead his side to a decent score of 141 before they were all out in 36.5 overs.

141 might be a decent score, but not one that would deter a star-studded Mohammedan from coasting. Mohammedan's opening batsmen Shamsur Rahman and Mohammad Ashraful provided the perfect launching pad, both scoring half centuries. Shamsur Rahman was the more attacking of the two as he struck six boundaries and an over-boundary to score 51 off 56 balls. He, however, couldn't finish the job on his own and got bowled out by Tariqul Islam with the team's score on 99. His opening partner Mohammad Ashraful, though, played a patient knock scoring his fifty off 87 deliveries. Tariqul got another scalp when he dismissed Navedul Hasan cheaply, but Ashraful held firm and stuck in with former Bangladesh opener Nafees Iqbal to guide the side for the rest of the chase. Ashraful ended unbeaten on 56 while Nafees was not out on 24 as Mohammedan completed the chase in 30.4 overs, scripting a SEE PAGE 18 COL 4
