

JS body slates  
ACC boss  
for declaring  
Matin clean

A parliamentary sub-committee yesterday criticised Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) chairman for declaring former adviser MA Matin 'clean man' in awarding the container-handling job at Chittagong Port, contrary to a probe report.

"The chairman has no right to declare Matin clean when a sub-committee got enough evidence of his corruption and irregularities," Shamsul Hoque, head of the sub-committee to investigate alleged Gatco graft cases said.

"We may send all documents and papers to other investigative agency on demand for further investigation," Shamsul, also a ruling Awami League lawmaker, told The Daily Star after a meeting of the sub-committee at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban.

# Trial by next Feb

The process of the much-awaited trial of the war criminals would start by February, said Law Minister Shafique Ahmed on the eve of the 38th Martyred Intellectuals Day yesterday.

During the Liberation War of Bangladesh, the Pakistani occupation forces and their local collaborators killed three million people, violated a quarter million women and eliminated the best Bangali brains on

December 14 in a plot to cripple the nation.

The law minister told The Daily Star, "I can tell you that the process of the trial of the war criminals would start either in the end of January or in the beginning of February."

His comments came against the backdrop of criticism for dillydallying policy to start the trial in the first year of the present government.

It is now almost certain that the two year-long demand of Bangladesh and small island nations for a legally binding agreement will not be met in Copenhagen as the time has already run out with lots of other issues unresolved.

Meanwhile, Danish police yesterday released nearly 1,000 protesters who were

detained during a mass rally on Saturday demanding strong actions from delegates at the UN climate conference.

In the first segment the UN climate talks have made some progress but still many of the toughest issues such as greenhouse gas emission target by 2020 and financing for poor nations to deal with climate change are yet to

Hasina was addressing the opening session of the second ministerial meeting of South Asia Education for All (EFA) Forum at the city's Sonargaon Hotel with Primary and Mass Education Affairs Minister Afsarul Amin in the chair.
