Bauls live very close to nature and people; they move from village to village soul searching through meditation and singing.

They hardly know anything about the Copenhagen climax and all that talks and bargains being held there this month.

But they are in close touch with the stories of people from communities around the country that has been ravaged by the climate change.

Nearly 200 Baul singers, at a rally at the city's Ramna Batamul on December 4, told the harrowing tales



of helpless people devastated by the climate change and their struggle and rights.

A group of men and women, who have lost their livelihood due to climate change, also presented their cases in front of a panel of judges. The CSRL of Oxfam-GB Bangladesh organised the programme styled "National public hearing on climate change and Baul rally" as part of a yearlong public hearing in different areas across the country.
