

# FFs for immediate start of trial of war criminals

Freedom fighters, the best sons of the soil, yesterday called on the government to start the trial of war criminals immediately, saying that the rule of law would not be established until the war criminals are brought to justice.

They also urged the people to boycott the war criminals socially.

The war heroes made the call at a 'Reunion of freedom fighters living in Dhaka and the Sector-2' organised by the Dhaka City Corporation at Osmani Udyan in the morning.

Sectors Commanders of the Liberation War and hundreds of freedom fighters along with their family members attended the programme.

Festivity was in the air as freedom

fighters wearing colourful bands and caps embraced each other and recalled the memories of the Liberation War of 1971.

A sculpture featuring war-related incidents and information in the Sector-2 was also unveiled at the programme.

The city corporation has also a plan to build more sculptures featuring information of other sectors at the Osmani Udyan.

Speaking on the occasion, Planning Minister AK Khandker, also deputy chief of the liberation war forces, said that the government would start the trial of war criminals at the beginning of the next year.

"Our dreams and hopes are yet to be materialised," he said, adding that the trial of war criminals must be held in the soil of Bangladesh.

Former army chief Lt Gen (retd) Harun Ar-Rashid said, "The anti-liberation ele-

ments have been strengthened over the years under the cover of dirty politics and are conspiring against the country."

Maj (retd) Ziauddin, a freedom fighter, said, "Different political parties exploited the freedom fighters over the years and some political parties even rehabilitated the war criminals and those who opposed the liberation war."

Sector Commander Maj Gen (retd) KM Shafiuallah also spoke.

Acting Mayor of DCC Anwar Hossain and Chief Executive Officer Nurul Islam welcomed the freedom fighters at the programme.

Cultural activists, including singers Abdul Jabbar, Fakir Alamgir, Timir Nandy, Shaheen Samad of Swadhin Bangla Betar Kendra, sang songs, which inspired the freedom fighters during the liberation war.

The day's main programmes would be followed by a cultural event where artistes of the university will perform with popular singers Kanak Chapa and Subir Nandi, said Assistant Prof Ali Asgar Chowdhury, also information and publicity subcommittee convenor of the

programmes.

The traditional dance drama 'Malika Banu' will also be staged in the local dialect at the cultural programme.

A friendly football match, prize-giving of essay competition and a reception to the CU cricket team, which became the first runner-up in the Second Asian Inter-Varsity Cricket Invitational Tournament-2009 held recently in Malaysia, would also feature in the programmes.

A hanging bridge was built on the canal between the Social Science and the Arts faculties symbolising strong bond among the students of all disciplines.

Mohammad Rashedul Hasan, a former student of CU, said the first-ever observance of the day generated much enthusiasm among the former students.

Another alumnus Mohammad Saifuddin echoed Rashedul and said, "I feel happy to think of meeting many of my university friends whom I have been missing so much."

Vice Chancellor Prof Abu Yusuf looked much pleased to make arrangement marking the day.

"The gathering of former students, who are now holding responsible posts at different organisations or established as professionals, business and political personalities, would inspire the present students to achieve their goals," he hoped.

Some students of Dhaka University (DU) attacked a voluntary blood donation programme of Sandhani when the students were barred from creating unnecessary gathering at the programme at TSC yesterday, leaving at least five people injured.

Of them, Mujahid Hossain, 30, Zakaria, 27, and Sujan, 18, were rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital while the rest were taken to other hospitals. All the injured were volunteers of Sandhani.

Officer-in-Charge (OC) Rezaul Karim of Shahbagh Police Station said a group of DU students made the attack on the blood donation programme arranged by Sir Salimullah Medical College unit of Sandhani around 1:30pm.



Another BDR man dies

A member of Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) died of rectum cancer at BDR Hospital in the city yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Havilder Abdul Mannan Hawlader, 52, posted at 23 Rifles Battalion in Khulna, says a BDR press release.

Mannan went on a medical leave on August 24 and took treatment at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU) and Cancer Institute Hospital at Mohakhali.

He had been undergoing treatment at Pilkhana BDR Hospital since December 1, the release added.

With the death of Mannan, so far 63 BDR personnel have died in separate incidents since the mutiny on February 25-26.
