

MU Fool-hammed City sack Hughes, hire Mancini

Fulham produced the latest twist in a see-saw Premier League title race with a shock 3-0 win over champions Manchester United at Craven Cottage on Saturday.

Goals from Danny Murphy, Bobby Zamora and Damien Duff condemned injury-hit United to their fifth league loss of the season.

Meanwhile, Manchester City manager Mark Hughes was sacked, despite seeing his side defeat Sunderland 4-3 in an Eastlands thriller, and replaced by former Inter Milan coach Roberto Mancini.

United's defeat left Sir Alex Ferguson's team, without several sidelined defenders, three points behind leaders Chelsea.

The Blues will extend their advantage to six points if they win away to relegation-threatened West Ham on Sunday.

"The way the league is at the moment I hope today is not too damaging. I hope it doesn't cost us the league," Ferguson told club channel MUTV.

"We'll have to get our defenders back to give us a proper chance of going for the league, there's no question of that. But if we get them back we'll be back in it."

At Eastlands, Roque Santa Cruz gave Manchester City a fourth-minute lead against Sunderland before Carlos Tevez made it 2-0 from the penalty spot.

But the visitors hit back through a John Mensah header before Jordan Henderson tied the match up at 2-2 from 14 yards.

Craig Bellamy restored City's lead with a curling shot but Sunderland replied again through Kenwyne Jones's 62nd-minute header, only for Santa Cruz to make it 4-3 seven minutes later.

Barcelona left it late before capping a superb year by clinching the Club World Cup here on Saturday.

The Spanish giants needed extra time to beat Argentina's Estudiantes 2-1 and secure their sixth title of 2009.

Mauro Boselli had put Estudiantes ahead after 37 minutes only for Barca striker Pedro to grab the equaliser in the dying minutes of the game, with Argentina striker Lionel Messi nailing victory after 110 minutes.

The Spanish giants end the year on a high after following up last season's league, Champions League and Cup treble with their first title in this competition.

Bellion fires Bordeaux

A double by former Manchester United striker Bellion inspired Bordeaux to a 4-1 home win over Lorient on Saturday that stretched their lead at the top of the French first division to nine points.

Having weathered early pressure from the visitors, Bordeaux took a 12th-minute lead when Bellion ran onto Yoann Gourcuff's through-ball before finishing between the legs of Fabien Audard.

Bordeaux coach Laurent Blanc shuffled his pack after the 1-0 mid-week win at Montpellier and his second-choice strikers combined for a second goal when Fernando Cavenaghi's flick-on was converted by Bellion, before

Cavenaghi slotted home from Gourcuff's cutback in the 52nd minute.

Gourcuff, France's player of the year, added his name to the scoresheet with 15 minutes to play as the champions made sure that they will head into the winter break -- which starts on Christmas Eve -- with the top of the division.

Lorient top scorer Kevin Gameiro, left out of the starting line-up, rewarded the travelling fans with a late consolation goal as Bordeaux's defence was breached for the first time in 710 minutes of football.

Second-placed Marseille can cut Bordeaux's lead back to six points if they win at third-bottom Saint-Etienne in the Saturday evening kick-off.

Montpellier's week went from bad to worse as they went down 2-0 at home to Nancy but maintained their hold on third place.

The newly promoted side

had not been beaten at the Stade de la Mosson prior to their defeat by Bordeaux but goals from Djamel Bakar and Pascal Berenguer consigned René Girard's charges to their second home loss in three days.

Paris Saint-Germain's indifferent form continued with a 1-0 defeat at Rennes, who prevailed via a goal by Guinean forward Ismaïl Bangoura five minutes before the interval that sent his side fourth.

Luckless bottom side Grenoble were denied only their second win of the season by an 84th-minute goal from Nice's Chouaki Ben Saada, which cancelled out Nicolas Dieuze's 75th-minute opener for the hosts.

Lens' trip to Valenciennes ended goalless, while Boulogne's home game with Sochaux was postponed after heavy snow posed a safety risk to spectators.

Kroos leads Bayer

Bayern Munich stay third and were ruthless against bottom-side Hertha Berlin in a 5-2 rout at Munich's Allianz Arena.

Bayern's Belgium defender Daniel van Buyten produced a

pin-point accurate header on 16 minutes before Gomez bagged his sixth goal in seven games when he converted a close pass from Germany team-mate Philipp Lahm on 31 minutes.

Gomez then turned goal provider when he set up Dutch star Arjen Robben on 33 minutes before rising star Thomas Mueller gave Berlin goalkeeper Jaroslav Drobny no chance to make it 4-0 on 60 minutes.

Defending champions Wolfsburg were held to a 2-2 draw by Eintracht Frankfurt to finish eighth in the table, while Bochum pulled away from the relegation zone with a 3-2 win thanks to a late free-kick from defender Christian Fuchs.
