

Stay aloof from criminal activities

Home minister urges BCL men

Home Minister Sahara Khatun yesterday called on Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) leaders and activists not to get involved in criminal activities, including tender manipulation.

"You people (BCL men) are a part of the ruling party. If you get involved in criminal activities, responsibilities of these crimes are put on the shoulder of the government," she said.

The minister said this at a discussion organised by Dhaka University (DU) unit BCL at Teacher-Student Centre (TSC) auditorium on the campus marking the Victory Day.

She warned of taking stern action against those who will be involved in criminal activi-

ties, including manipulation of tenders.

"Nobody will be spared. Not even if they are members of the ruling party," the minister added.

She sought assistance from the party men as well as the countrymen to uproot criminal activities, including militancy, extortion and tender manipulation.

"If the countrymen help us, it is possible to stop militancy, extortion and other criminal activities in the country for ever," the minister added.

She hoped that BCL leaders and workers would play a vital role in stopping distortion of history by members of BNP and its student body Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD).

Tafazzul takes oath as CJ today

President Zillur Rahman will administer the oath at Bangabhaban, Supreme Court Registrar Md Shawkat Hossain said yesterday.

On December 15, the president appointed Justice Md Tafazzul Islam, a senior justice of the Supreme Court (SC), as the Chief Justice.

The registrar added that outgoing Chief Justice MM Ruhul Amin made a farewell call on the president at Bangabhaban yesterday.

Justice Ruhul Amin did his routine works on the last working day yesterday, said Shawkat.

DEFAMATION CASE
HC asks govt not to disturb Amar Desh editor, 2 others

The High Court yesterday directed the government not to disturb the Amar Desh Editor Mahmudur Rahman and two others till January 3 in connection with a defamation case filed in Magura.

A vacation bench of Justice Md Ashfaqul Islam fixed January 3 for hearing on the bail petitions filed by three accused at the regular bench of the court.

Earlier in the morning, the same bench sent the bail petitions to the chief justice for a decision, saying that as a judge of the vacation court he would not hear the petitions for anticipatory bail.

Chief Justice MM Ruhul Amin returned the petitions to the same bench asking it to hear and pass order on the matter.

Mahmudur Rahman, the Amar Desh Publisher Hashmat Ali and reporter M Abdulla filed the petitions yesterday morning seeking anticipatory bail in the defamation case filed against them.

Magura district Swachchhaab League Convener Advocate Ashraf Hossain Liton on Monday filed the case with a district court against them for publishing a news item on December 17 titled 'Allegation of taking 5 million dollars against prime minister's Energy Adviser Tawfiq-e-Elahi Chowdhury and son Sajeeb Wazed Joy'.

In the case statement, the complainant said the report has tarnished image of the government and prime minister's son Joy, and also hurt the people with conscience of the country.

Barrister Rafiqul Huq appeared for the petitioners, while Attorney General Mahbubul Alam opposed the bail prayers.

Introduce lane system on major roads

A parliamentary body at a meeting yesterday stressed the need for increasing fitness of police members and suggested introducing age-based training for them in addition to physical, mental, motivational and armed training.

The parliamentary standing committee on home ministry also expressed satisfaction over "bringing the horrific traffic congestion to order" and asked the Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) authorities to introduce 'lane system' on other major roads for movement of different modes of vehicles.

Replies to a question, the standing committee chairman said almost all the recommendations of the committee on home ministry taken so far have been implemented.

In its last 12 meetings this year, the committee has made some 30-35 recommendations. Of them, 11 decisions remained under various stages of implementation, he mentioned.

Call to include safety edn course in school curricula

Speakers at a roundtable yesterday stressed the need for incorporating safety education course in the academic curricula at primary and secondary levels for growing ethical and moral values among children.

They said this at the roundtable styled 'Role of cultural personalities and mass media in incorporating the safety education course in textbooks' organised by Breaking the Silence, an NGO working for children, in cooperation with Save the Children, Sweden-Denmark, at the National Press Club in the city.

Presenting a keynote paper, Rokhsana Sultana, senior programme coordinator of the NGO, said the aim of the course is to make the children capable to protect themselves from different anti-social activities, including eve teasing, sexual exploitation, trafficking, drug addiction, child marriage and AIDS, through informing them of the adverse effects of such activities.

"The safety education course should be incorporated in the textbooks, because the

children learn the basic knowledge from their textbooks," she added.

Rokhsana placed a set of recommendations, including an active role played by cultural personalities and mass media in incorporating the course in the textbooks.

Other recommendations include publication of a news item related to child exploitation and its follow-up news, involvement of children in different cultural activities and awareness of exploitation-free atmosphere for the children.

Speaking as the special guest, Shamsul Alam Bakul, deputy country representative of Save the Children, Sweden-Denmark, underscored the importance of creating awareness for checking childexploitation.

Actor Abdur Nur Tushar said, "Child exploitation is a social problem. First, we should create responsible person in society for eradicating social problems."

'Women's contribution yet to get due recognition'

Women played a very important role during the liberation war, but they never received the recognition they deserve, said speakers at a reception yesterday.

During the liberation war, women provided the freedom fighters with food and shelter, nursed the injured and also took part in guerrilla warfare heroically while many became victims of rape and many other forms of atrocities, they also said at the reception at the Jatiya Mahila Sangsta auditorium in the city.

They demanded women get due recognition for their role during the liberation war and immediate trial of the war criminals.

Jatiya Mahila Sangsta of the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs accorded the reception to women freedom fighters, including Deputy Leader of the Parliament Syeda Sajeda Chowdhury, Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury, Dr Mahkdom Nargis Ratna, Zinnatunnisa Talukdar, Jannatul Ferdous, Rafia Akter Doly, Farida Akter Saki and Bharati Nandi Sarkar.

Miscreant shot in gunfight with police

One miscreant sustained bullet injuries in a gunfight between police and armed cadres at Karial slum in Gulshan area in the city yesterday.

The injured, identified as Md Masud, 20, was rushed to Dhaka Medical Hospital with bullet injuries.

Officer in-Charge of Gulshan Police Station Kamaluddin told The Daily Star that some four to five criminals entered the Karial slum by a microbus around 6:30pm.

On information, a team of plainclothes police challenged the microbus, but the criminals tried to flee the spot firing from the microbus targeting the police.

The police also exchanged fire.

After the gunfight, police arrested injured Masud and Shah Alam with two foreign-made pistols and eight rounds of bullets.

Other criminals managed to flee away. Police seized the microbus.
