6 stabbed in city

Criminals stabbed six people in two separate incidents in the city's Kafrul area within a span of 20 minutes.

Three out of the six injured are security guards while the rest are construction workers.

The injured security guards are Masud, 26, Jahid, 24, and Ershad, 20, while the three construction labourers are Sagor, 20, Anis, 18, and Babul, 20.

They took first aid at Dhaka Medical College and Hospital.

Police said four to five criminals at around 7:00am stabbed three security guards of an underconstruction building and after only 20 minutes another incident took place just beside that building where three people were stabbed.

Officer-in-Charge of Kafrul Police Station Delwar Hossain told The Daily Star that extortion might be the reason behind the incidents.

Says air chief

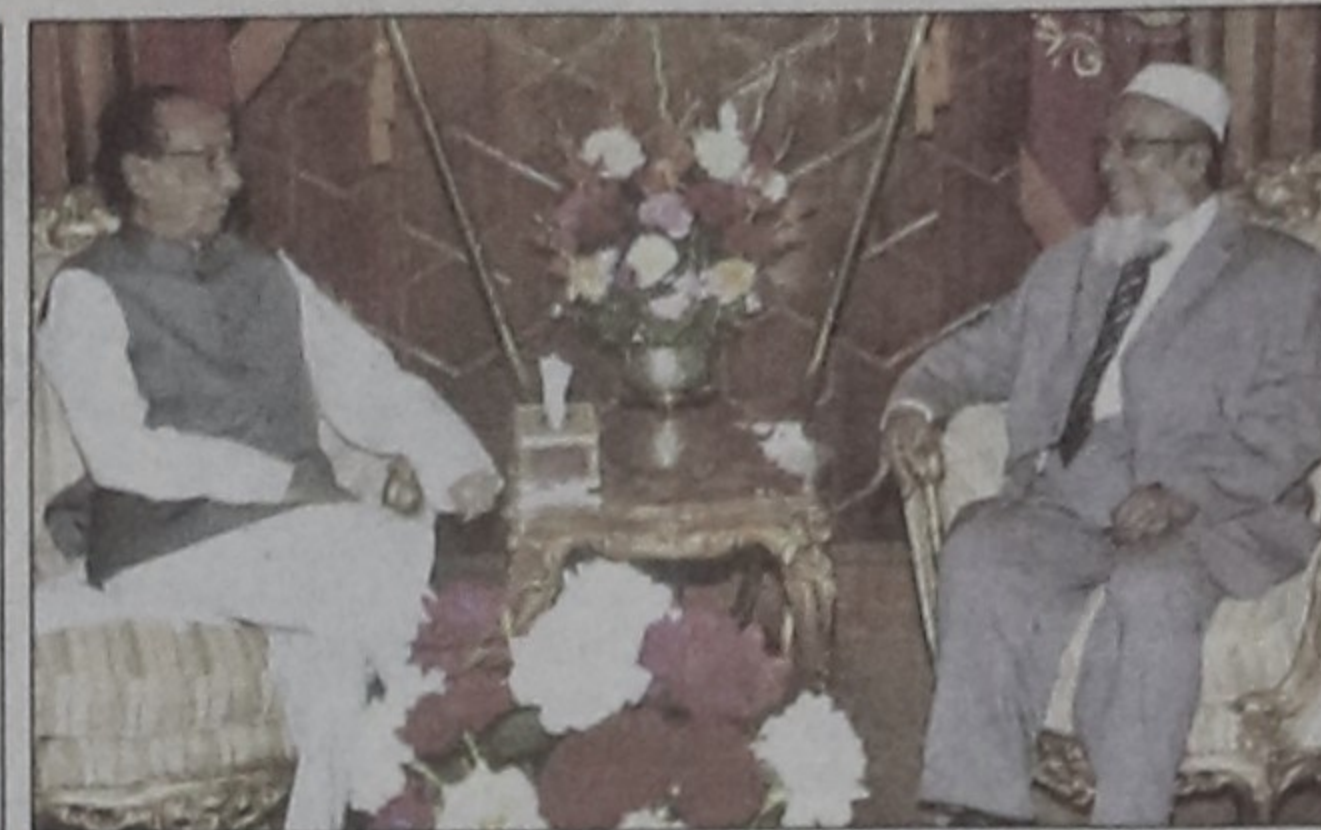

ASA official shot

A gang of criminals sprayed an NGO office with bullets at North Moisundi under Sutrapur in the city in broad daylight yesterday, leaving its manager injured.

The victim was identified as Abdul Halim, 40, a manager of the North Moisundi branch of Association of Social Advancement (ASA), an NGO.

The manager was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) with bullet injuries to his chest, abdomen and hand.

Police and the victim could not ascertain the cause behind the gun attack.

Halim told reporters at DMCH that a gang of three criminals entered his office around 2:00pm, carried out the gun attack and fled the spot.

At lunchtime, a youth entered the ground floor of the

two-storey NGO office when he and his colleague Abdul Awal were there, the manager added.

The stranger then asked for a glass of drinking water and Awal went to another room leaving him (Halim) alone to fetch water, he said, adding that taking the chance, two other criminals entered the office room and shot at him.

Hearing the gunshots, his colleagues thronged the spot while the attackers managed to escape the scene, Awal said.

Senior Assistant Commissioner (AC) SM Murad Ali of DMP Demra Zone said as the victim was undergoing treatment and unable to speak after undergoing a major surgical operation, police could not ascertain whether the criminals came to commit a robbery or had previous enmity with the victim.

'Establish positive image of UP'

Democracy Watch, a non-government organisation, yesterday urged the government to take steps for informing people about the existing laws, ordinances, policies and important notifications relating to Union Parishad (UP) so people's rights can be ensured.

Democracy Watch made the call from a press conference held at Dhaka Reporters Unity in the city.

Reading out from a written paper, Froz, director of Democracy Watch, said good governance could not be established without strengthening the local government and the local government can play key roles in establishing transparency and accountability.

He also urged the media people to play positive role on local issues through their

objective reports in order to ensure people's rights.

Later, a set of recommendations was placed at the press conference to establish 'positive image' of Union Parishads across the country.

The recommendations include arranging orientation programme for the elected local representatives about their work area, type and power, introducing ward meeting to ensure accountability, specific policy for UP initiative for making database of vulnerable groups and enhancing the power of UP to collect tax and toll.

Chairman of Purnimagati Union of Sirajganj Gazi Khorsheed Alam, Chairman of Atigram UP of Manikganj Nargis Akhter and Democracy Watch director Mostafa Sohail were present at the press conference.

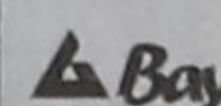
